Korean Aid Drive Now Under Way

Harrisburg — Calling upon the leaders of the big veterans organizations in Pennsylvania, and their affiliates, to spearhead the drive for \$500,000 for the American-Korean Foundation, Governor John S. Fine said:

"No other group in our great State has the same understanding of the suffering and misery which accompany wars as do our veterans and the members of their auxiliary units.

"Personal experience has given them knowledge of the needs of those who are crippled, land maimed, destitute and disabled, and of those who have become widows and orphans.

"They are fully equipped to do a magnificent job in the organization and promotion of this worthy project."

The Governor pointed out that Pennsylvania was asked by the national foundation, of which Dr. Milton S. Eisenhower is chairman, for \$500,000 of the five million dollars to be raised for the 900,000 displaced persons, the 100,000 orphans, 300,000 widows, 15,000 amputees, the 300,000 sick and destitute civilians behind the South Korean lines, and the 100,000 homes so far destroyed.

Joseph S. McCracken, of Kingston, past State Department Commander of the American Legion, past Vice President of the Pennsylvania Joint Veterans Council, and at present the Chairman of the Pennsylvania Veterans Commission, was appointed by the Governor as chairman of the American-Korean Foundation.

"The successful accomplishments of this assignment to us, as veterans and auxiliary members, presents a serious challenge," McCracken said. "It has been accepted for all of us by our Department Commander and Presidents.

"Through our local Posts and Units, all groups working together in our respective communities, we can again, by our united efforts, prove to our neighbors from other states that Pennsylvania can and will, thru its organized veterans' groups, lead the nation.

FARM CALENDAR

MILK GOOD FOR CHICKENS — Milk is a good feed for chickens of all ages because it contains proteins, vitamins, and minerals, says F. H. Leuschner, Penn State extension poultry specialist. It has been demonstrated experimentally that milk has another value, he explains. It stimulates feed consumption in general.

USE GOOD RAM — A good purebred ram will do more than anything else to improve the type and conformation of the lamb crop, reminds Thomas King, Penn State extension livestock specialist. Use of a grade ram or even a mediocre registered ram usually means that the flock will gradually go downhill instead of improving.

PLANTS NEED LEAVES — A plant has three main parts: roots, stems, and leaves, according to extension gardening specialists of the Pennsylvania State College. The roots gather water and food materials which go through the stems to the leaves to be manufactured into the organic compounds which are food for people and animals.

CONTROL QUACKGRASS — Chemicals, effective in spot treating of quackgrass, are too expensive on large areas, says George Berggren, Penn State extension agronomist. For more extensive control of quackgrass he recommends proper tillage.

USE BAND SEEDING — For sowing grasses and legumes, James Eakin, Penn State extension agronomist, suggests band seeding. In this type of seeding the grass and legume seed is placed behind the drill disk and directly over the fertilizer band.

INCREASE POPPIES — If you wish to increase the supply of Oriental poppies in your garden, be sure to cut the roots into 2-inch pieces and plant them in good soil, says A. O. Rasmussen, Penn State extension ornamental horticulturist.
