Highway Hypnosis One Of Driving's Greatest Hazards

Highway hypnosis is an especially dangerous and often fatal summer complaint.

What causes it and how can it be combated?

"Monotony, repetition and freedom from distraction are the relaxing factors which often lull motorists into a trance or self-induced hypnosis," warns Edward P. Curran, safety director of Keystone Automobile Club. "Other factors are sense-dulling summer heat and humidity, and new super-highways and turnpikes that wind thru the country-side for hundreds of miles without billboards, stop lights and intersections."

"The car's purring mechanical perfection, the seemingly endless stretches of bright road surfaces, the minimum of grades and curves, the rhythmic pattern of lights at night, also add to the cumulative hypnotic effect. Then comes the danger: the driver has ceased to think and be alert and the car literally is driving itself toward an accident."

"What can we do to avoid hypnosis?"

"Several simple but very effective things. On long trips motorists should stop at regular frequent intervals and get from behind the wheel for a cup of coffee or a 'stretch'. If driving alone, the motorist should lower the car windows in order to create a breeze, munch candy or chew gum, and turn on the car radio. One must be careful in using the radio, however; commentators and speakers will help to keep the senses alert, but such things as soothing music must be avoided."

"Passengers in a car can be a big help in overcoming the trance-like state of mind by keeping up an interesting flow of conversation. In fact, this is one instance in which back-seat or side-seat driving is highly excusable—if it isn't too distracting."

"Summing up, then, the motorist can avoid dangerous mental numbness by having a mild curiosity about everything and by employing slight distractions to keep the mind from taking a psychic siesta."

Safety Division Lists Canning Don'ts

Many housewives will be busy during the weeks ahead putting up nutritious food for the winter months. Canning involves hazards, therefore, the Division of Farm and Home Safety Education, State Department of Public Instruction, urges close attention to safe practices.

The Division, in cooperation with the Pennsylvania Rural Safety Council, gives the following "don't" for safety's sake:

1. Don't hold produce over; if you must, in an emergency, keep it in the refrigerator.
2. Don't try to can non-acid vegetables or fish, meat, or poultry, unless you have a pressure canner. The deadly bacilli botulinus may get you if you do.
3. Don't try to do too much in one day.
4. Don't use rubber rings a second time.
5. Don't delay between steps in canning.
6. Don't can on excessively hot, humid days because the

Good Bear Hunting Season Is Forecast

Early in July two Pennsylvania game protectors in the "big woods" country reported bears in numbers.

Robert F. Eleinbarger, Coudersport, Potter County, wrote: "Numerous bears have been seen in this area lately. Altho they migrated to more southern counties last fall I believe they are returning to the northern tier counties to be on hand for a good crop of berries and beechnuts."

Gerald D. Kirkpatrick, Portland Mills, Elk County, reported: "Bear hunting should be at its best this fall. There was one bear killed on the highway in my district a while back. I received reports of at least three more that were hit by vehicles but not killed. In one case a truck struck a bear, catching it on the front bumper and carrying it for about 50 feet."

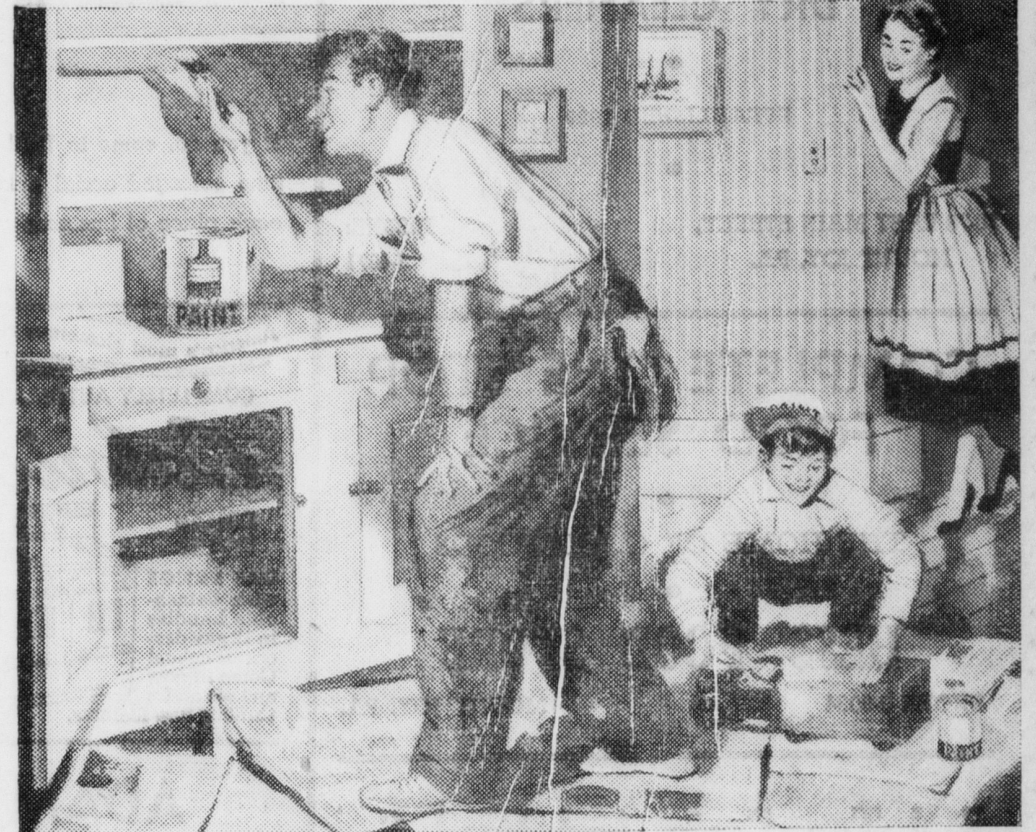
