## Lancaster Soil Conservation Dist. Enters National Contest

Lancaster soil conservation district has entered the national Soil Conservation Awards program sponsored by the Good-year Tire & Rubber Co. of Akron, Ohio, it was announced today by District Chairman Amos Funk, of Millersville.

Members of Lancaster district will compete against other soil conservation districts in the state. Non-partisan judging committees, selected from Pennsylvania's outstanding exponents of the soil conservation movement, will determine the state's outstanding district for the period July 1, 1953, and April 30, 1954 on a basis of total points scored in performance, of regular district duties.

Grand award for one member of each winning district governing body and the top cooperating farmer or rancher named by the district will be a one-week, expense-free, vacation trip to Goodyear's fabulous winter resort, the Wigwam Guest ranch on Goodyear farms in Litchfield Park, Ariz., in December, 1954.

Members of the Lancaster district governing body, who will compete for the Goodyear award are: Henry Hackman, of Manheim R2; Homer Graybill, Manheim R1; Lemon Wiest, of Ephrata R1; Harry Metzler, of Kreadyville.

National winners of the Goodyear Soil Conservation Awards will be announced at the seven regular area meetings of the National Association of Soil Conservation districts. Plaques will be awarded at these conventions to the hundred first second place winning districts.

## Corn Picker Operators Urged: Play It Safe

Corn picker operators are urged to play it safe this season in a film strip, entitled "Are You Inviting Corn Picker Accidents," released recently by the Division of Farm and Home Safety, State Department of Public Instruction. The strip, produced through the cooperation of the National Safety Councils was made available to county agents and area supervisors of vocational agriculture for showing in rural areas.

Faulty adjustments and operating practices not only cause unnecessary clogging and subsequent accidents but they also cause the big corn losses out of the field. The film strip emphasizes operators are warned never to count on a stick or corn stalk to protect them when unclogging a picker. The revolving rollers can pull in the stick—and the operator's hand before he can let go of the stick.

STATE'S CANNED FOODS PACK WOULD FILL 172-MILE TRAIN

The food packed annually by Pennsylvania canneries, if shipped out of state entirely by rail would require enough cars to form a giant train stretching 172 miles from engine to cabooses.

The state's packers are producing about 39,600,000 cases of vegetables, fruits, soups, meat and other foods, according to Mr. R. C. Brumbaugh, AmericanCan Company field research representative. On the basis of an average of 2,000 cases for each carload this sizeable food pack would fill 19,800 cars.

"The distribution of the Keystone State's annual pack results in an income of about \$220,521,000 to Pennsylvanians in virtually all parts of the state," he added.

Five major vegetables constitute the largest part of Pennsylvania's annual packs. These are tomatoes, snap beans, green peas, sweet corn & lima beans.

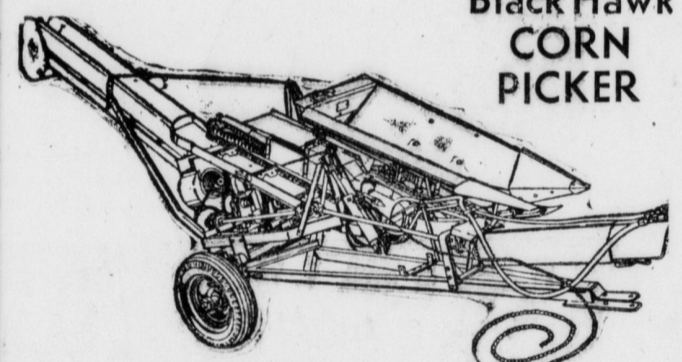
