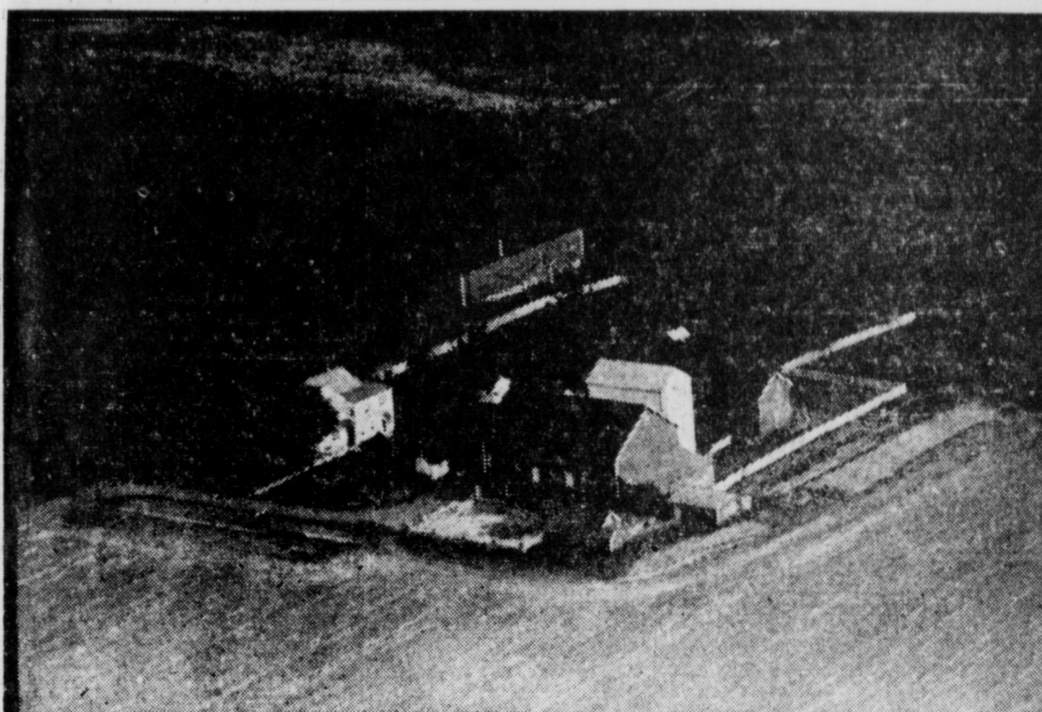
Executive Director Will Speak Here
