Farm Calendar

CLEAN PAINT BRUSH - To keep your paint brush from getting stiff and gummy overnight, hang it in turpentine or some other softening agent.

Charles G. Burress, Penn State extension agricultural engineer, says excess paint should be worked out of the brush on a board or paper before it is hung in the solution.

NEW TOMATO PEST - Tomato growers have a new pest to worry about, reports John O. Pepper, Penn State extension entomologist. It is the tomato russet mite. It causes injured plants to turn bronze when it sucks the content of plant cells on the surface of leaves and stems. Dusting sulphur has been the best control in other states.

FEED GOOD HAY - Be sure to save some of the highest quality legume hay for the poultry. Penn State extension poultry specialists say that such hay can take the place of some expensive grain. Before feeding the hay cut it into 1 to 4-inch lengths with an ensilage or straw cutter. Then it can be fed in racks or on the floor.

EAT MORE BEEF - Because of favorable beef prices, compared with pork costs, Americans are eating more beef this year than in 1952. Gorlon Rivers, Penn State extension agricultural economist, believes it will be 73 pounds per person, a gain of 12 pounds over last year.

BALE GRASS SILAGE - If a chopper is not available to handle grass and legume silage, a pickup baler may be used without twine, says Burton Horne, Penn State extension agricultural engineer. The untied "plugs" are easier to handle tangled forage.

CONSIDER MILK TANK - Several factors must be considered by the dairyman who is thinking of buying a coldwall milk tank, says Ivan Parkin, Penn State extension dairy specialist. How many cows can

HERD CLASSIFICATION

Brattleboro, Vt. - Harvey Rettew, of Locustcroft Farm, Manheim, Pa., has recently had his herd of registered Holstein-Friesian dairy cattle classified for type (body conformation) under the official Type Classification program, conducted by The Holstein-Friesian Association of America, national organization of Holstein-Friesian cattle breeders.

Official inspector was J. A. Fairchild, Berwick, Pa. This was the second time the herd has been classified under the official program, maintained in an effort to improve still further the Holstein breed.

Of 11 eligible animals in the herd now classified, three are designated "Very Good, six "Good Plus", and two "Good".

MAINTAIN EGG QUALITY - To maintain quality of eggs, gather them three times a day, reminds F. H. Leuschner, Penn State extension poultry specialist. Cool them quickly and pack them daily. Store in a cellar with a temperature of 50 to 60 degrees and a humidity of 75 per cent. Market at least twice a week. Precool the cases.
