Movable Shelf Units

NEAT, economical, movable shelf units are a boon in any home, where they may be used for various things such as storing toys, canned goods, laundry equipment, seldom-used kitchen utensils or other things.

Each unit may be any height. The number of shelves may vary according to their distance apart.



The usual width of a unit is three feet, and the shelf depth is 11 1/2 inches.

The accompanying illustration reveals the construction. Note the triangular pieces of Tempered Preswood used at the back to brace each unit. The 3/4" thickness of this material is used as shelf surfaces because of its long-wearing quality, its resistance to moisture and its hard, smooth surface which makes it easy to keep clean.

The shelves merely are laid in place without fasteners. They may be nailed down, of course, for a permanent installation. Either leave them unpainted or color them any attractive hue. Incidentally, Tempered Preswood has no splinters, and that's a comfort when there are youngsters around.

Farm Calendar

PLANT CORN STORAGE — If your corn crop is so large that it will need additional storage space, Charles G. Burress, Penn State extension agricultural engineer, suggests early planning. He reminds that your county agent can help in planning new or remodeled cribs or bins. He also has plans for corn drying.

GATHER EGGS EASILY — Poultrymen can save steps by letting the laying hens do the walking. F. H. Leuschner, Penn State extension poultry specialist, suggests arrangement of the nests in one section of the pen, preferably near the door. This will save time and effort in gathering the eggs.

LEAN PORK WANTED — Consumers are showing more and more preference for lean pork produced by the meat-type hog. According to Dwight Younk, Penn State extension livestock specialist, this meat-type hog can be produced with any breed by selecting the long ear-bodied, smoother, and firmer-fleshed gilts.

MULCH THE SHRUBS — To help maintain soil moisture for shrubs now and during the winter, apply mulch materials at least three inches deep after watering and then wet the mulch, suggests John Moszaros, Penn State extension ornamental horticulturist.

CHECK ON HERD HEALTH — Only a healthy, high-producing herd should be stable for winter milk production, emphasizes Joe S. Taylor, Penn State extension dairy specialist. He urges checking on the health of all animals, including heifers added to the herd.

CLEAN AIR CLEANER — Working in dusty fields is hard on the tractor. Burton Horne, Penn State extension agricultural engineer, says that cleaning the air cleaner will aid efficient operation.
