Navajo Indian Film Scheduled Here Saturday

A colorful, heart-touching Indian story which accurately portrays present-day life and conditions among the Navajo Indians will be presented this Saturday evening, Oct. 3, at 7:45 p.m., at the Mount Joy high school auditorium. Produced by New Life Films, Peoria, Ill., "CALL of the NAVAJO" is a story that grips the heart. In gorgeous color throughout is presented the story of Ashkee who lived with his big father, Navajo John; his mother and little sister. Like so many Navajo Indians of the Southwest, they are shepherders. Disaster comes to the family after young Ashkee who plans to be a medicine man, refuses to listen to the Gospel of the white missionary. He is strongly tempted to steal a beautiful silver belt at the trading post but finally overcomes the temptation. Nevertheless disaster follows. A coyote attacks the flock he is guarding. A rattlesnake is encountered in the great rocks. The water hole dries up and little sister becomes violently ill. And Ashkee is quite sure that all this happened because the missionary's God is angry with him for wanting to steal the silver belt! The plot continues with thrilling adventure and a really surprise ending.

CALL of the NAVAJO is a religious, dramatic feature-length 16mm. Christian film in beautiful color and sound. It will be shown with a newly-acquired Victor Arc Projector by Century Gospel Ministries. This film has been the most popular in 1953 of all films in the film library of this organization. A cordial invitation is yours to see this marvelous Christian film. The free-will offering which is to be received will be used to sponsor a missionary project at the Navajo Mission, Blanco Trading Post, Bloomfield, New Mexico. This Mission is located in the area shown by the film, and it is under the leadership of Rev. and Mrs. Wilmer Heisey, formerly from Mount Joy. Miss Ruth Zercher, R.N., is employed at the Mission also, being a former resident of Mount Joy. A brief account of the dedication of the Navajo Hospital will be presented by Rev. Albert Engle, Grantham, Pa.

Teachers Conference Scheduled Oct. 10 At Millersville

Millersville, Pa. — The ninth annual In-Service Teachers Conference will be held Oct. 10 at Millersville State Teachers College. Over 600 teachers from Lancaster, York, Lebanon, and southern Dauphin counties are expected to attend the conference. It was announced by Dr. Eugene K. Robb, Director of the MSTC laboratory school, general chairman. A staff of 25 laboratory school teachers and college professors and area teachers has prepared 16 demonstrations and discussions with the theme "Fullest Growth in a Free Society."

Channel 15 Goes On Air Oct. 15

WLBR-TV, South Central Pennsylvania's newest television station, will provide residents of the Mount Joy area with Grade "A" reception when it goes on the air Oct. 15. The Lebanon station will operate on UHF Channel 15. Studios, transmitter and tower are located in the South Mountain range, seven miles from Lebanon, near Mt. Gretna. From this 900 foot site, and its newly-erected 572 foot tower, WLBR-TV expects to telecast a strong, clear TV picture to the entire area, including Lancaster, York, Harrisburg, Lebanon, and the western section of Berks County. Programming plans, as announced by the Lebanon station, include top-rated film shows not now available here, first run movie hits, and local programs and personalities, new to television, but popular with Central Pennsylvania audiences.
