**Safety First Urged When Operating Corn Picker**

An urgent appeal to every corn picker operator to safeguard life and limb was made last week by Harrison Noll, Lancaster County farmer and president of the Pennsylvania Rural Safety Council.  
 "Corn pickers and harvesters are mighty fine pieces of machinery and save a lot of labor," the Council president declared, "but they have absolutely no respect for your hand, or arm or even your life. Once it is caught in powerful jaws of steel, your hand or your arm is just another ear of corn to be torn from the stalk. Be smart. Don't give the picker a chance to go to work on you."  
 Safety suggestions from the Division of Farm and Home Safety Education, State Department of Public Instruction include the following: (1) Stop the picker and shut off the power before adjusting, oiling or unclogging the machine. (2) Keep all guards in place. They are for your protection. (3) Vent fires by keeping trash from gathering on hot manifolds or exhaust accessories.  
 Safety suggestions from the Division of Farm and Home Safety Education, State Department of Public Instruction include the following: (1) Stop the picker and shut off the power before adjusting, oiling or unclogging the machine.
