State Nurses Association Will Mark 50th Year

Fifty years ago nurses performed duties which were quite simple compared to the highly specialized tasks of many of our nurses of today.

Nurses now perform many duties which once occupied the valuable time of physicians, much as taking blood pressures and giving hypodermics.

The hospital staff nurse of today was almost unknown fifty years ago. Most nurses upon graduation from nursing school were employed in private duty.

Today a nurse, upon graduation may decide if she wishes to enter private duty, become an administrator or educator, enter the field of industrial nursing, become a public health nurse working in schools or doing visiting nursing, or enter one of the branches of the armed services.

Fifty years ago the home was still the scene of most medical activity. Few babies born in 1903 uttered their first cry in a hospital. Only for a serious illness or major surgery did a patient go to a hospital.

A nurse today is in constant demand; she can practice anywhere in the country and will never lack employment.

Some Facts on the Pennsylvania State Nurses' Assoc.

Fifty years ago a small group of nurses met in Philadelphia for the purpose of promoting state registration for Pennsylvania nurses. One hundred and twenty nurses were present.

From this small group was organized the Pennsylvania State Nurses' Association whose present membership numbers more than 16,000 graduates, licensed, registered nurses, the largest association of its kind in America.

The motive behind the association's efforts for registration and state licenses of nurses was not only to elevate the standards of their profession but also to protect the citizens of Pennsylvania from unqualified nursing care.

The association secured registration for nurses in 1909 and compulsory licensure in 1952, thus entering that only duly qualified, licensed nurses may practice professional nursing.

The golden anniversary will be celebrated this week in Pittsburgh (Oct. 13-16) when the association holds its annual meeting. Its members have worked hard through the years to promote the standards of the professional nursing.

In a highly specialized world they have constantly sought to define the qualifications for the practitioners of nursing, including those in the various fields of nursing speciality.

They have taken their stand for legislative action which concerns itself with the general health and welfare of our citizens.

They have provided periodic surveys of the nurses resources of the state.

Professional counseling service is given free to nurses and their employers in regard to employment opportunities and personnel available.

They have provided spokesmen to represent nurses with governmental agencies with allied professional groups and with the public at large.

Finally, they have earnestly sought to promote and protect the economic and general welfare of nurses.
