The association secured registration for nurses in 1909 and compulsory licensure in 1952, thus entering that only duly qualified, licensed nurses may practice professional nursing.

The golden anniversary will be celebrated this week in Pittsburg (Oct. 13-16) when the association holds its annual meeting. Its members have worked hard through the years to promote the standards of the professional nursing.

They have taken their stand for ieglslative action which concerns itself with the general health and welfare of our citi-

They have provided spokesmen to represent nurses with governmental agencies with allied professional groups and with the public at large.

Finally, they have earnestly sought to promote and protect the economic and general welfare of nurses.
