November 1 Marks Date Of New Command At Marietta T. C. Depot

Marietta, Penna., Nov. 1, the transportation material command will become operational at Marietta. The new command will take over the functions of the supply field service agency which agency will become defunct Oct. 31. The new organization will have additional unfunctions in that it will perform the technical and operational functions pertaining to equipment, procurement, supply distribution, depot maintenance, standardization, production engineer, industrial mobilization and maintenance on T.C. equipment.

This task will be performed by a branch office in Virginia and four field installations, one in Marietta; one in Odgen, Utah; one in Charleston, S. C. and one in Baltimore, Md. Since the new command will take over the supply field agency, no additional personnel will be required. The new organization commander will be Col. Howard A. Malin, formerly of West Chester, Penna. Prior to coming to Marietta, he was with the transportation corp of the United States Army in the Far East and served with the eighth army in Korea. Col. Malin's aide will be Col. Roy Goode, chief maintenance office, chief of transportation.
