CASTLE AFB—This station's hopes of winning the Strategic Air Command bombing and navigation championship for an unprecedented third time will be riding on the efforts of the two top crews of the 93d Bombardment Wing of which A/2c Leonard H. Johnson, combat crew gunner, will play a vital role.

All crew members who were selected for their outstanding ability, will leave this weekend for Walker AFB, Roswell, N. M. and the tournament which is being held from Oct 26-31.

Entered in the Strategic Air Command "World Series of bombing and navigation" are the top crews from 21 SAC bases from coast to coast as well as entry from the Royal Air Force all striving for the coveted Fairchild trophy. Participating aircraft will include the giant B-26, the B-47 jet bomber and the B-29 and B-50 Superfortresses. Airman Johnson will be flying in the latter.

The bombing and navigation competition was started in 1948 and was won by Castle in 1950 to become the first "double winner."
