Postage Rate Hikes Announced

Rate hikes in postage has announced by Elmer Zephey, acting postmaster. All letters except to Canada and Mexico are eight cents for the first ounce and four cents for each additional ounce. To Canada and Mexico, the sum is three cents per ounce or fraction. Post cards will be four cents for singles and eight cents for doubles. Printed matter, which will include unsealed Christmas cards, is 2c for the first two ounces and 1 1/2c for each additional two ounces or fraction. Samples of merchandise, commercial papers, small packets and 8-ounce merchandise parcels have also had rate increases. Persons desiring to mail articles mentioned in this group should contact the Post Office for full particulars. The postmaster also wishes to remind all residents to start thinking about doing mailing for Christmas holidays. It is to be realized that mail which ordinarily would take two days will take several days during the Christmas rush. It is suggested that stamps be purchased and mailing done early. If there are any problems or if any information is desired relative to the postal service, persons may feel free to call at the postmaster's office and discuss it with him.

Cattle Bloating Traced To Disease Named Choke

Failure to keep cattle out of orchards, corn fields and gardens after the fall harvest may result in costly losses from "choke", the American Foundation for Animal Health said today. Foundation officials said "choke" was not uncommon in cattle because they naturally swallow food the first time without chewing it much. Ear corn, potatoes, cabbage, beets and apples were listed by the Foundation as common causes of the condition. "Regardless of the cause, drooling and bloat may be the first symptoms when a cow is choking," the Foundation said. "Affected cows also often hold their heads low with necks stretched out, while coughing, gasping, and open mouth breathing also are common indications of the problem." Affected animals will make no attempt to eat or drink. Since similar symptoms may be shown also by cattle affected with rabies, bloat, bronchitis, wooden tongue and other diseases, an immediate diagnosis is necessary to determine the trouble, the Foundation said. "Failure to obtain competent aid immediately may be costly," officials said, "because badly choked cattle are liable to die of bloat within a short time." Veterinarians may use drugs to relax the throat muscles of the cow so that the offending object may be removed more easily. In other cases, instruments may be used to obtain relief. In extreme emergencies to relieve the bloating, the Foundation said.
