LOCAL SOLDIER TAKES PART IN EXERCISES

Pvt. Isaac G. Kanode, son of Mrs. Anna W. Kanode, Mount Joy R1, took part last week in Exercise Mudlark, annual fall training maneuver of the U. S. Forces in Austria.

Pvt. Kanode, who entered the Army last March, is a driver in the 4th Armored Cavalry Reconnaissance Battalion's Howitzer Company. Salzburg, Austria—Troops of U. S. Forces in Austria (SUFA) moved into the field early Monday morning (Oct 26) to begin "Exercise Mudlark," the command's annual fall training maneuver. As "Freeland" forces they set up a defensive line running roughly from Burghausen southeast through Radstadt to St. Margarethen.

In the four-day make-believe struggle, "Freeland" forces, composed of units from SUFA's Tactical Command, were outnumbered three-to-one by the aggressor Army moving from "Eastland," which included a mobile British Infantry Battalion from British Troops Austria.

The situation at the beginning of the exercise found aggressor forces advanced past Camp McCauley to the Salzkammergut region of Austria where they had captured intermediate objectives and were regrouping to continue their assault to the southwest. SUFA staff section headed by "Mudlark" director Lt. Gen. William H. Arnold, stood ready to develop exercise situation from their command post in the vicinity of Anif.

Both "Freeland" forces under Brig. Gen. Charles E. Hoy, and the "Eastland" aggressors, commanded by Col. John E. Frick, had tactical air support placed at their disposal by the U. S. Air Force.

The aggressor forces attack was spearheaded by the crack U. S. 4th Armored Cavalry Reconnaissance Battalion and the mobile British infantry.

The average number of patients per day was 358.

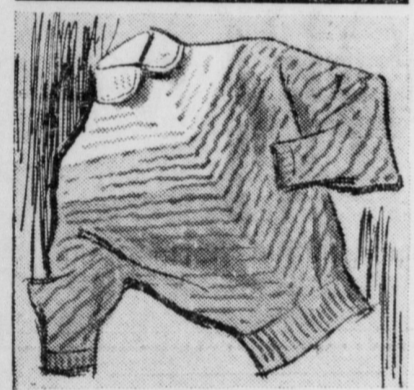
