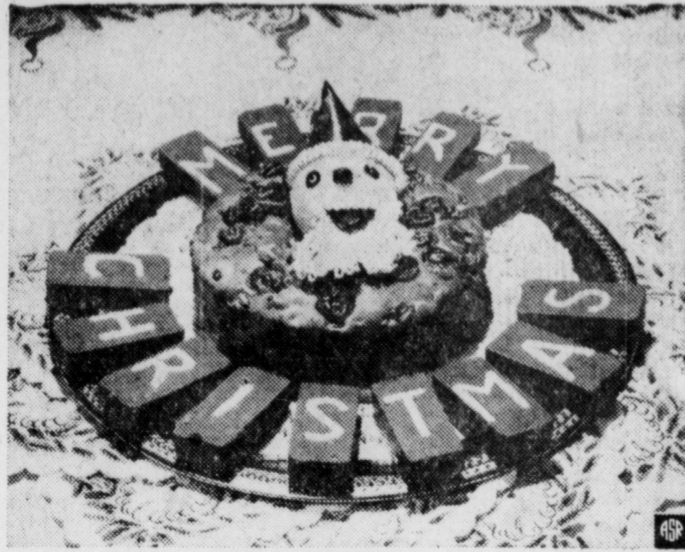

Candy Bars Spell Merry Christmas



This is a most practical Christmas decoration. Because every bit of it—with the one exception of poor Santa's head—can be eaten. And each piece is delicious!

Turn the backs of Milky Way bars—then letter them with icing. This is easy to do, even for the most amateur confectioner. Use the recipe that follows. One letter of MERRY CHRISTMAS is etched on each bar with the aid of a pastry bag. The result is a gay-looking, good-tasting decoration that's bound to be the delight of Christmas parties. And, how easily this idea can be adapted to other holidays of the year.

Regal Icing

1 cup confectioners' sugar 1/2 cup boiling water
1/4 teaspoon cream of tartar 1 egg white

Put all ingredients in a large bowl. Beat with rotary beater or electric beater at high speed until frosting is thick enough to stand in peaks. This will take 15 minutes or more, but it does the frosting no harm to interrupt the beating from time to time.

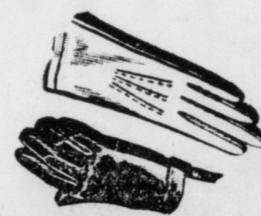
