### SULFA DRUG APPROVED FOR FOULBROOD CONTROL

Sulfathiazole, used in a well-planned program and over a period of at least three years, can control American foulbrood in apiaries, according to E. J. Anderson, professor of agriculture at the Pennsylvania State University.

Considerable work with sulfa drugs and their control of American foulbrood was included in the beekeeping research program at Penn State during 1953. Tests indicated that if a careful program of control is not followed, foulbrood will spread throughout the apiary and cause heavy losses.
