Band Records of Ducks Released In State

Continuing the program of rearing, leg banding and releasing ducklings, the Game Commission liberated 7104 of the fowl in suitable Pennsylvania areas in the spring and early summer of 1953. The program is based on the expectation that released waterfowl that elude gunners and natural enemies enroute to southern wintering grounds will return to liberation areas to rear broods, thus increasing the number of ducks in this state. Though it is impossible to obtain records on the flight habits and survival of all ducks liberated, band returns do provide information from which the authorities can improve the project.

It is interesting to know the distance and direction traveled by some of the ducks released in 1953. Late in January of this year the record looked like this: 893 bands returned from ducks shot or located in Pennsylvania (258 of these were checked during banding operations at Pymatuning Refuge after the close of the 1953 gunning season. These ducks survived their first waterfowl season and represent potential breeding stock for 1954). Reports on 23 of the banded birds came from New York State; 20 from the Province of Ontario; 11 from Michigan; 5 each from New Jersey, Virginia and North Carolina; 4 from Maryland; 3 from Minnesota; 2 from Indiana and Tennessee;

and 1 each from Massachusetts, Delaware, Province of Quebec, West Virginia, and Ohio. The total return was 978, or 13.7% of those liberated in '53.

Band returns from ducks released by the Commission in '52 received during 1953 waterfowl season and until late January this year, totaled 33. Of these 28 came from this state. One each was returned from Illinois, New Jersey, New York, Michigan, and the Province of Ontario. Recent-month band returns from ducks liberated by the Commission in 1951 numbered 7. Four were from Pennsylvania. One was received from each of the states of Delaware, New York and Minnesota.

These records indicate that ducks released and one and two years prior to the receipt of band reports returned as per blue print to increase the supply of native ducks for Pennsylvania hunters.

Perseverance of Deputy Owcser Unravels Theft

Every so often a deputy game protector does an outstanding bit of investigation or shows unusual courage or tenacity in bringing a criminal to book. In this case keen observation, a "hunch" and dogged persistence provided the solution to a motor boat theft uncovered by a deputy named George S. Holden.

While returning to his home in Downingtown after checking woodchuck hunters on August 31, 1953, Holden's suspicions were aroused by an exceptionally large motor boat at a Bradwyn Creek dam in Chester County. He checked with the local fish warden for knowledge he might have on the craft. He then examined the boat carefully and located the motor serial number plate, which had been removed and thrown away. Within a few days the canvas cover and the windshield were stolen from the boat. The theft of these parts and failure of an owner to appear convinced Holden something was definitely wrong and the boat was placed in a barn for safe-keeping.

The deputy enlisted the assistance of the Pennsylvania State Police. He then began corresponding with the Detroit manufacturer of the boat, the Florida boat corporation that installed the machine in one of their vessels, the original purchaser of the boat (an Atlantic City man), and finally the New

Jersey State Police. An adjuster for the company that insured the craft in question came to identify it since a claim for its loss had been paid the owner.

On January 30 of this year Holden received a letter from a captain of the New Jersey State Police saying that the case had been concluded. The New Jersey officer reported the last owner of the boat lives in Gwynedd Valley, Montgomery County, Pa. The craft and trailer had been stolen from a yacht basin in Cape May County, N. J. on August 31, 1952. It was taken by an unknown person who towed it off, on its trailer, behind their auto.

Some Deer Left

A Fayette County game protector J. R. Hiller, reported early in January: "Many of the hunters think there aren't many doe deer left hereabouts. During Christmas week, three antlerless deer were killed on the highway in my district, and herds of deer are already coming to our turkey feeders."

Squirrel Migration Stops

Game Protector Charles Hertz reported: "In October, 1953, Deputy Frank Baum and I were on patrol in the Linn Run section of Westmoreland County. A migration of gray squirrels forced us to stop the auto for about twenty minutes to avoid running over the little fellows. It seemed as though the whole mountain were moving. We estimated there were about 5000 squirrels in the mass migration."

Rare Deer Damage Complaint

In December, Game Protector R. V. Rea, Somerset County, reported: "Recently a man registered an unusual damage complaint with me. He showed me about 4 or 5 inches of the point of a deer antler. This was the man's story: He hauled mine props on a truck. A day or two before our meeting he discovered one of the 12-ply tires on his truck was flat. When the tire was taken apart it was found the piece of antler had gone through the tread and out the side. The trucker had no idea where the tire had picked up the antler point."

Bears In Southcentral County

"Huntingdon County is not classed as true bear territory, nevertheless 5 bears were killed in the northern part or along the northern boundary line last season." So says Game Protector Ross G. Metz, of Petersburg, continuing, "One of the bears bagged weighed around 350 lbs. On Sunday following the last day of bear season Rob't Black, of Alexandria, driving through Diamond Valley, came onto a good size bear lying in the middle of the road licking its paws.

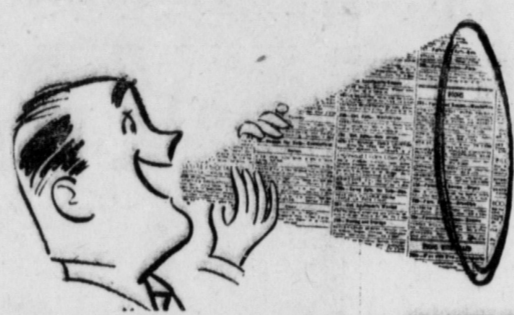
"On the opening day of buck season three bears were chased out ahead of a deer drive on the south side of Tussey Mountain. We have had a number of bears in that section for the past three or four years."

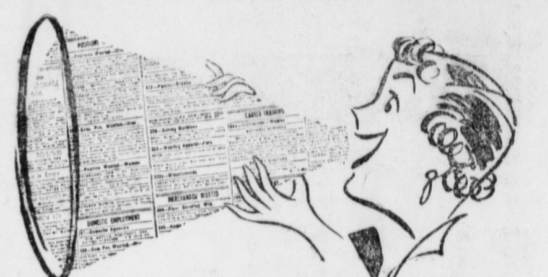
TWO ARE PROSECUTED
