the guest minister will be Dr. Clyde W. Meadows, pastor of the King Street United Brethren Church, Chambersburg, Pa. Dr. Meadows is a graduate of Huntington College, Huntington, Indiana and Gettysburg Lutheran Seminary. From the latter he earned his B.D. and S. T. M. degrees. From the former he received the honorary degree of D. D. in 1940.

Dr. Meadows is a past president of the Chambersburg Rotary Club; member of Local Advisory Board of the YMCA; member of the Department of Evangelism of Penna. Council of Churches; member of Board of Directors of the Penna. Christian Endeavor Union; Vice President and member of the Ex. Committee of the International Society of Christian Endeavor; Vice president of the Penna. Sabbath School Association and shares in many other denominational and interdenominational agencies and organizations. He is the author of the book "Why We Choose Christ" and the pamphlets "Evangelism Through the Local Church" etc.

The congregation that Dr. Meadows pastors members 1250 members. The Church School averages 950 in attendance. During the twenty-five years of his present pastorate the congregation has spent \$227,000 in a Building program that will take another \$215,000 to complete. In addition to all this, the King Street Church supports seven missionaries, full time and several others part time.

The fields in which they serve are Sierra Leone, West Africa; China, Jamaica and in the Bahama Islands. Since 1933 Dr. Meadows has assumed the added responsibilities of Conf. Supt. along with his pastorate.

Favorite hobbies of Dr. Meadows are flying, music and wood working. He holds a private pilot's license for flying light aircraft and has been flying over 15 years.
April 1, Dr. and Mrs. Meadows will leave for a trip to the Holy Land. The trip is an all expense paid gift of the congregation to their pastor and wife in appreciation of their 25 years of faithful service.
