State College, Pa. — Wider participation and clarification are the objectives in planning for the 1954 Pennsylvania Crop Improvement Association One Acre Corn and Certified Small Grain Contests.

Both contests are sponsored for junior farmers 21 years or younger to stimulate interest in utilization of the largest Pennsylvania agricultural research developments. Vocational Agriculture Teachers act as officials. "With two years contest experience and many worthwhile suggestions from County Advisors and Vocational Agricultural Teachers, we believe that we will be able to make the 1954 Contests bigger and better", Oscar L. Hostetter, PCIA Education Committee chairman said. "We hope to have a complete information folder on these Contests available by planting time", he said.
