Passion Play To Be Given

Final rehearsals are now being held for the 24th annual presentation of the Passion Play of Harrisburg, which will be presented April 7, 8, 9 and 10, at 8 P. M., at Zembo Mosque Third & Division Streets, Harrisburg, Pa.

More than 125 persons will take part in this unique stage presentation which has become the object of an annual lenten pilgrimage for many thousands of persons from near and far since its inception 24 years ago. The Passion Play Symphony Orchestra accompanies the two hour performance, along with an organ, heightening the drama of its varied serene and climactic moments. The play, unique in that it is done completely in pantomime (considered the 'lost art' of the theatre—an art which this group has done much to restore) is set in 5 acts and 20 scenes, beginning with Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem, his teachings and the events of His life during Holy Week, climaxing with the Crucifixion and glorious Resurrection in the garden of the tomb on Easter morn. The five acts include The Triumphal Entry, The Passover Feast, The Arrest, The Trials and Condemnation, and The Crucifixion and Resurrection. The player's action on stage is related simultaneously by a narrator, thus increasing the effect of the pantomime and intensifying the drama. Each player's movement on stage is carefully studied so that narration and action are in time and harmony. A public address system is used so that wherever you sit in Zembo Mosque's large auditorium, you may hear clearly.

There are 1500 free seats for each performance, with a limited number of reserved seats available. Out-of-town group reservations for 25 or more persons are available in either the free admission or reserved sections. Direct inquiries to the Passion Play, 30 North Third Street, Harrisburg, Pa.
