Surviving are three sons and two daughters: Paul J. Florin; Mary C., wife of Joseph Sabina; Charles T., Philadelphia; Ephraim S., Florin; and Josephine S., wife of William Beck, Florin; also 7 grandchildren and 13 great grandchildren.

Funeral services were held Thursday afternoon from the Fred Groff Funeral Home, Lancaster with interment in the Camphill Cemetery in Florin.

### MAN FOUND DEAD

Daniel Verga, 66, was found dead in his bedroom at Dronays Cafe, 30 Jacob St., at about 10 a. m. Monday.

Dr. David E. Schlosser, deputy coroner, said death was caused by a cerebral hemorrhage. He estimated Verga died at 4 p. m.

The body was found by the owner of the cafe, Joseph Arbutina, 153 Locust St., Columbia, and his son-in-law, Charles Donan. They had to force their way into the cafe since the doors and windows were locked.

Verga, a native of Yugoslavia had been employed by Arbutina for about a year and had been living at the Franklin House, Columbia. Arbutina recently bought the Mount Joy cafe and Verga started moving his belongings to the cafe Friday night and was serving as watchman and handyman.

He tended bar at the cafe Saturday and returned to Columbia for several hours on Sunday, according to Mrs. Arbutina. She said he drove back to the cafe about 9 p. m. Sunday. Neighbors noticed lights burning in the cafe early Monday morning. Verga leaves a cousin in Pittsburgh.
