**Religious Film To Be Shown In High School**

Colleen Townsend Evans, former Hollywood actor and LIFE magazine cover girl, will appear in the film GREAT DISCOVERY to be shown Saturday evening, April 3, 7:45 p. m., at the Mount Joy High School Auditorium.

Colleen Townsend was born in the foothills of the Sierra Madre Mountains in Glendale, Calif. After graduating from Hollywood High she went to college in Utah. She received her contract with Twentieth Century-Fox in February, 1947.

Within a short time she had co-starred with Dan Dailey in "When Willie Comes Marching Home" and had major roles in several other films, among them "Chicken Every Sunday" and "The Walls of Jericho." The acme of picture fame came when her photo appeared on the cover of LIFE. Innumerable magazines rushed to feature her and billboards followed suit to cash in on her wholesome beauty and sparkling personality.

Colleen meant what she said when she quit a promising career in Hollywood to devote her life to Christian service. Colleen followed that decision in 1950 by taking Bible courses in two schools in California, then married Louis Evans, Jr. Today they are in Edinburg, Scotland, where Lou is working for his doctor's degree in theology and Colleen keeps the home fires burning as well as caring for their infant son Danny, born a few months ago.

**FROZEN MEAT PATTY COOKS WELL ANYWAY**

To thaw or not to thaw—that is the problem homemakers face when cooking frozen meat patties.

Marjorie J. Wormeck, extension nutritionist at Pennsylvania State University, says it depends on whether the homemaker wants to take the patties from the freezer an hour before cooking. That goes for pork, beef, and lamb patties.

Cooking time is not shortened much by thawing. There's little difference in taste. Thawed patties do have greater weight loss than unthawed ones. The bacterial count of the cooked meat shows little difference.
