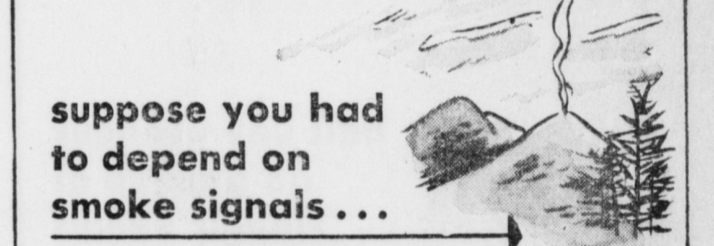
LEGAL NOTICES

MOUNT JOY TOWNSHIP SCHOOL PER CAPITA TAX.
The School District of the Township of Mount Joy gives notice that its School Board intends to adopt a resolution on May 3, 1954, at 6:30 p. m., standard time, at Florin School Building, levying a per capita tax of \$5 for the school year 1954-55 on each adult resident of the area now comprising said School District, under the provisions of the Act of 1947, P.L. 1145, as amended, in addition to the \$5 per capita tax authorized under the School Code of 1949. Said tax, so far as collected from residents of the part of said school district which will constitute a portion of Elizabethtown Area School District after July 5, 1954, will be for the use of said Area School District; and so far as collected from residents of the remaining part of Mount Joy Township School District (which will continue as a separate school district) will be for the use of the latter. Imposition of this additional tax (from which it is estimated that \$8,500.00 annual revenue will be derived is necessitated because of increased school costs; because the per capita tax authorized under the School Code is limited to \$5; and because it would be inequitable to property owners to collect the entire amount of said increased costs of real estate taxes.
