At the borough council meeting this week, authority members asked council members about the matter. Council in turn voted that the authority group shall supply the missing numbers needed.

According to S. H. Miller. president, it is expected to take approximately two weeks before the survey can be reported to the state. After the state's approval is received, a special meeting will be called between the two groups, water authority and borough council.

The project will then be ready to be put out in bids for construction of a sewage system for the entire borough.


