intersection of David and Lumber Streets. Presently located on David Street, the signs will be placed on Lumber Street on a temporary basis to check their effectiveness.

Men Assigned Jobs
John L. Schroll was re-assigned to the Board of Health for a term of five years.

Mrs. Frank Young, Sr. was given the job of receiving police calls after the police radio is installed in the police car. She will then be receiving fire, ambulance and police calls.

To Ask Permission to Run Light
Council went on record to have the secretary write a letter to the state department asking permission to use the traffic light at the intersection of Main and Market Streets on the same hours as the two lights at either end of the borough. At the present time, the lights at the two extremities are in use from 6:30 a. m. to 10:30 p. m. and the Market Street light is used only four hours per day five days per week.

Following a "secondhand" report suggesting that council check on safety hazards on personal property, the men decided that such matters will be discussed only if a formal complaint is issued either in person at the meeting or by signed petition. The same action will help enforce the dog ordinance. If there is a dog habitually running loose in a certain neighborhood, the citizens are asked to issue a complaint.

Employees Request Change
The borough employees requested that they be paid each week instead of every 2 weeks. The request was granted that the employees shall be paid each Friday for the work done the previous week.

The group decided to have the heating system of the fire-house checked; not to purchase any new playground equipment this year and to excuse no special "excuses" for parking meter fines.

Bills to the amount of \$1,454.21 were ordered paid.

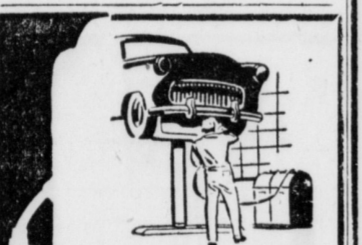
Educational Week For The Blind To Be Observed

The Annual Educational Week for the Blind will be observed May 4, 5, 6, and 7 at the Malta Temple, 235 East King Street, Lancaster.

The causes of cataract are largely unknown. Contrary to popular belief, a cataract is not a growth on or in the eye, but simply a clouding of the lens inside the eye. Blindness follows when this blocks light from reaching the retina, the sensitive nerve-film of vision.

"The only effective treatment for cataract is the removal of the lens by surgery and substitution of a man-made lens, or eyeglasses. Cataract operations are neither rare nor dangerous; at least 19 out of 20 bring improved vision to the patient."
