## Conservation Work Progresses in Area

Excellent field conditions enabled Soil Conservation Service technicians to map 5,414 acres of farm land in Mount Joy-Marietta area. Robert Cruikshank, with the cooperation of local farmers, has been able to map the soils, slope and erosion in the area with good results. This brings the area surveyed to about 8,000 acres since the work started early in March. The continued cooperation of local farmers is requested so that a complete soil survey of Lancaster county may be published.

The cooperators of the Soil Conservation District have taken advantage of the early spring to install contour strip cropping on 390 acres. The S. E. S. technicians in the Northwest part of the County have assisted district cooperators to install 3,750 feet of tile drains.

The District furnished 4,500 trees and 10,000 shrubs for planting areas not suited to cultivation.

At their monthly meeting in April, the directors approved 21 applications for conservation plans. Included in this number were the following farmers:

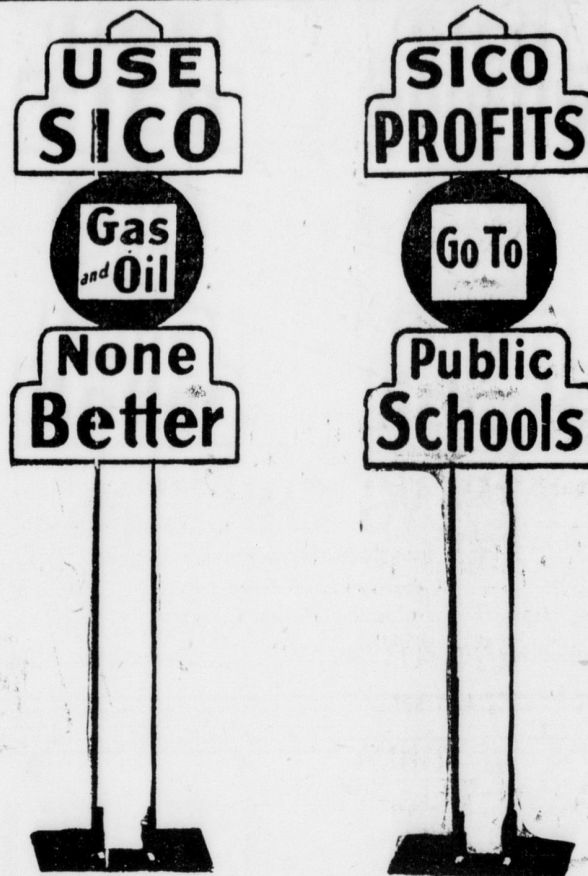

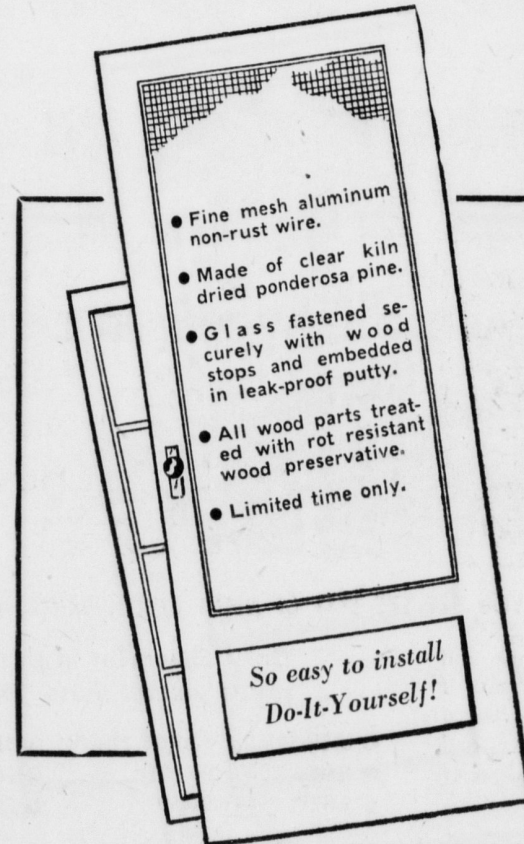

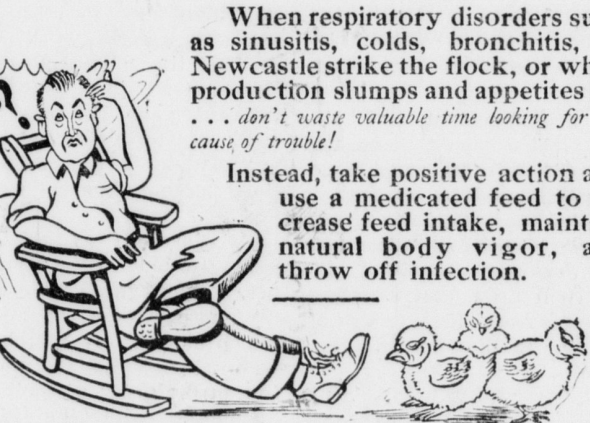
