Group To Join Crop Improvement Asso.

State College, Pa.—This year for the first time, local business, civic organizations and the Agricultural Extension Service will join the Pennsylvania Crop Improvement Association in enlarging the scope of its statewide corn and small grain growing contests for junior farmers 21 years or under, according to Bud Hartung, Executive Secretary of the Association.

"One youngster who doubles average neighborhood yields of corn or small grain through following modern crop improvement recommendations, including the use of new crop varieties, can do more by way of getting these better farming practices into wide use than we could ever hope to accomplish in any other way in many years", Oscar L. Hostetter, PCIA Education Committee chairman said.

Prior to this year, only the Pennsylvania Farm Bureau Cooperative Association had joined the PCIA and Vocational Agriculture teachers to encourage contestants and supplement PCIA trophy awards with Farm Bureau cash prizes. This year according to Hartung, other allied agricultural businesses and civic organizations are helping to encourage contestant enrollment and will offer prizes of their own to winners in their immediate area.

"We hope to have at least one organization in each county who will supplement PCIA trophy awards with their own prizes in recognition of the great pioneering job these youngsters are doing for the betterment of the agriculture of their immediate area and of the state", Hartung said.

Deadline for registration is May 31. Information folders and registration cards are available from County Agents and Vocational Agriculture teachers, who will do the officiating, or directly from the PCIA office at Box 536, State College, Pa., Hartung said.

Korean Vets Program Ends Aug.

Summer school, starting within the next few weeks, will provide the last chance for thousands of post-Korea veterans to start training under the Korean GI Bill, Veterans Administration said today.

The veterans who must act in a hurry, if they want GI schooling, are those who were discharged or separated from service before August 20, 1952, and who have not yet taken advantage of the GI training benefit.

Under the law, they must enroll in, and actually begin, an approved program of training before this coming August in order to continue afterwards. For veterans who fail to act in time, the chance to train will be gone for good.

The problem facing schooling veterans is that few summer schools will be in session on the August 20 deadline, VA explained. For that reason, the veterans will find that summer classes, getting under way shortly, will be the last classes in which they can start training before the cut-off date.

For veterans planning GI on-the-job training, the need for action is just as important, if not so immediate. Job training programs also must be started by August 20, but arrangements for beginning training are not tied down to the beginning of a term, as in the case with schools. The August deadline for starting applies only to post-Korea veterans who left the service on or before August 20, 1952, VA emphasized. All veterans separated after that date will have two years from the time of their release to begin.

To be eligible for training under the Korean GI Bill, a veteran must meet all three of these requirements:

He must have been separated from active service under conditions other than dishonorable.

He must have been on active duty in the armed forces anywhere in the world—not necessarily in Korea—after June 27, 1950.

He must have had at least 90 days of active service in the armed forces unless he was discharged sooner because of an actual service-connected disability.
