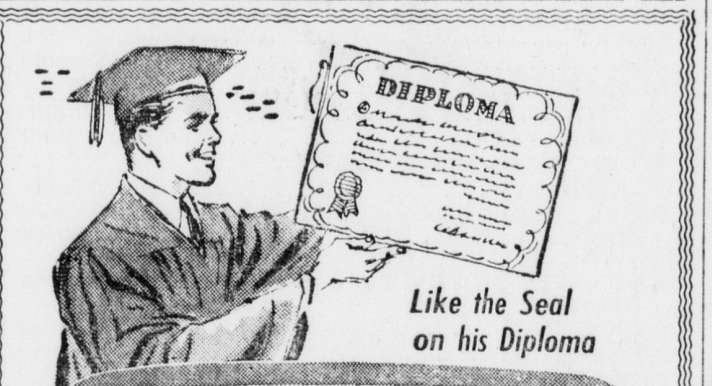
ATHLETE IS HONORED
