Beekeepers Preparing For 50th Anniversary

Preparing for the Golden Jubilee on August 20 and 21, leaders of the Pennsylvania State Beekeepers Association met recently at the Pennsylvania State University to plan the busy program. The 50th anniversary meeting will take place at Penn State.

Two outstanding apiarists have been obtained for a series of lectures during the two days. Dr. E. Braun, senior apiarist at Ottawa, Canada, and Dr. J. T. Hambleton, in charge of beekeeping research for the U. S. Department of Agriculture at Beltsville, Md., each will review current research on practical topics.

George Rea, Reynoldsville, former State apiarist, and former Extension apiarist for Pennsylvania, will review the history of the association at the opening program at which H. K. Beard, Sheridan, association president is in charge. Miles Horst, former State Secretary of Agriculture, is on the opening day's program.

For the banquet Friday evening, August 20, Dr. E. P. Burton, Harrisburg, of the Penna. State Educators Association, has been scheduled for the main address.

Prof. Edwin J. Anderson, University apiarist, pointed out that the anniversary celebration closes the week of the annual beekeeping short course under his supervision. Enrollment for the short course is under way now, he said. Prof. Anderson also will review research in both apiculture management and marketing of bee products during the anniversary events.

Pennsylvania's "Honey Queen" will be crowned as a feature of the Golden Jubilee.

State Craft Fair Will Feature All Exhibits

Picturesque Carlisle, Pa., will again be the site for the annual State Craft Fair of the Pennsylvania Guild of Craftsmen, July 30 and 31, and August 1.

The Craft Fair takes place on the Dickinson College campus, in the heart of an area that is a living history book, with its many Colonial and Revolutionary associations, and numerous buildings dating back to the nation's early days.

For the three days of the Craft Fair, members of the Guild will demonstrate their talents and exhibit their best works. The Dickinson College campus will become, in effect, an outdoor and indoor crafts school, where experts will show how they go about their work, and answer questions from their audiences.

Crafts of the guild include weaving, pottery, woodwork, needlework, block printing, silversmithing, leatherwork, bookbinding, rug hooking, rug weaving, and others which will be demonstrated.

A Fashion Show of handwoven fabrics which have been loomed by members and cut and sewn into handsome items of apparel will be held Saturday afternoon, July 31.

Admission to the Fair and its activities is free.

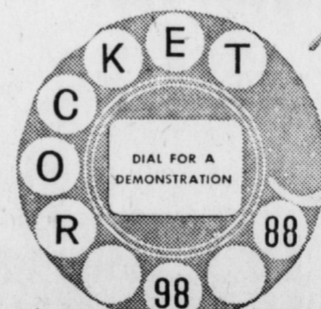
