

Margery L Bessom, extension clothing specialist, at the Penna. State University, points out that the sole of a good shoe will bend at its widest part. Leather soles are generally better than rubber or plastic soles which are too warm.

Look for firm but pliable tops on shoes. Oxfords are a good shoe for general wear for the school-age child. Four to six eyelets are advised.

Canvas shoes do not give much support and are hot. They are a shoe to wear a short time, such as for athletics and beach wear.
