For the children there will be free souvenirs, ice cream and free rides. Seventy-five cash prizes will be awarded to Club members who register at the park on picnic day.

Miss Taylor will be seen as Alma Winemiller, a repressed Southern girl who is attracted to a dashing and uninhibited young doctor. Obstacles to their romance are caused by their families and the divergent personalities of the two young people. Also adding complications is Rosa Gonzales, daughter of the owner of a gambling casino, who tries to win the young doctor and Harry Sheppard plays his father. Mason Curry and Kay MacDonald portray Miss Taylor's parents. Phyllis Tillinghast will be seen as Rosa.

Others in the Gretna cast are Gene Galvin as Rosa's Mexican father; Vanita Brown as a high-spirited young girl; Larry Quinn as Miss Taylor's timid boyfriend; Louise Schulz, Ann Herr and Robert Cannon as literary society members; Jack Gilchrist as Dusty and James Ray as a traveling salesman.

Ray appeared in the Circle-in-the-Square production of "Summer and Smoke" which made a star of Geraldine Page. He also worked for two years with Margo Jones, director of the Dallas Theatre in Texas, who staged the Broadway version of the drama.

The play will run through July 15, excluding Sunday. Curtain time is 8:30 p. m.
