### Farm Calendar

**Mulch Aids Garden** — Mulch in the garden has five advantages. Robert Fletcher, Penn. State extension vegetable specialist, says the most obvious advantages are less work and weed control. In addition, mulch retains moisture for growing plants, adds humus to the soil, and reduces the need for cultivation.

**Save Tractor Fuel** — To show how important tractor maintenance is, Burton Horne, Penn. State agricultural engineer, cites the amazing loss of U. S. farmers. Many gallons are lost by running a tractor with dirty plugs, air cleaners, and oil filter; improper adjustments of valves and carburetors; and poor tire inflation.

**Barbecue Broilers** — Broilers can be barbecued more easily over charcoal fires in barbecue grills, explains Carl Dossin, Penn. State extension poultry specialist. Plans for the grills prepared by Penn. State poultry are available at county agricultural extension officers throughout Pennsylvania.

**Be Careful** — Between 200 and 400 persons are killed each year by lightning. Joseph McCurdy, Penn. State extension agricultural engineer, says you are safest in a large building during a thunderstorm. Lie down if caught out in the open.

**Control Lice** — John Pepper, Penn. State extension entomologist, suggests control of body lice on chickens by dusting a light application of 5 percent DDT on the birds after they have settled down for the night.

**Buy Flower Seeds** — Seed of English daisy, pansy, and other flowers to be planted in August and early September should be bought now, reminds John Meszaros, Penn. State extension floriculturist.

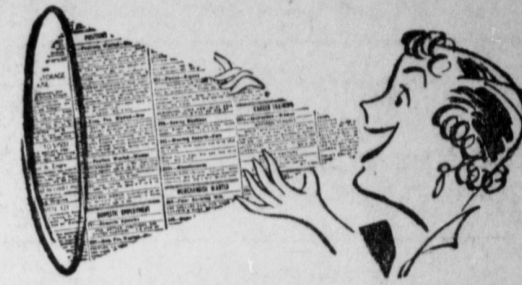

Timely Reminders from The Penna. State University College of Agriculture.

**Care for Embossed Cottons** — Bleach turns embossed cottons yellow and weakens the material. Bernice J. Sharp, Penn. State extension clothing specialist, points out that embossed cotton material won't need any starch because the finish for embossing also provides stiffening.

**Making Jelly** — Not more than 6 to 8 cups of juice should be made into jelly at one time. If more juice is used, you have to boil it longer. This causes loss of flavor and darkens the jelly.

**Buying Clothes** — No garment is better than the material that goes into it. So examine fabric for closeness and evenness of weave. It's not how much money you spend on clothes but how much planning and management you put into your purchases that count.

**Need for Companions** — Children need companions their own age. They need the opportunity to learn to cooperate, to lead, and to follow. Young children should have a place where they can entertain their friends.

**Install Tile** — Plastic or metal tile is easy for the family handy man to put in a kitchen, bathroom, or laundry. The light, easy-to-cut tiles aren't expensive. They give an attractive wall surface that cleans and lasts a long time.

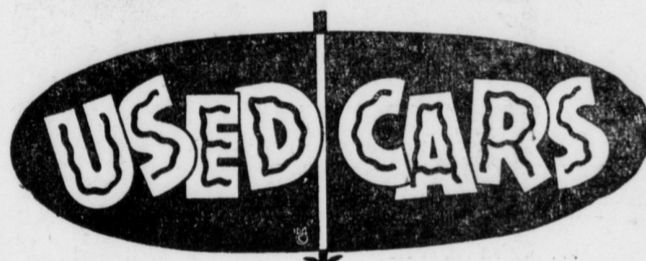
