PP&L'S Safety Record Cited In Contest

A low accident frequency rate in 1953 has earned Pennsylvania Power & Light Company a third place award in the most recent annual National Safety Council contest. PP&L's, president, Chas. E. Oakes, received the award certificates from Harry N. Croder, president of the Lehigh Valley Safety Council, in the utility's general office building, Ninth & Hamilton Sts., Allentown, at special mid-morning ceremonies Monday, July 26th.

Mr. Oakes accepted the award on behalf of all PP&L employees whose outstanding safety efforts helped merit the citation. He pointed out that the safety record was compiled on a systemwide basis and not merely confined to a single working location in the company's service area.

PP&L won its third place award in Group A, electric division, of the Public Utility Safety contest. The group was composed of those electric utilities which work in excess of 400,000 manhours each month. The local utility had a 1953 accident frequencies in the group.

PP&L had also won a third award in the 1951 nation-wide contest, but missed an award last year as it placed fourth in its group.

Present at these ceremonies were: Harry Ferguson, Vice President, Operation; George M. Keenan, Vice President, Engineering; R. C. Swartz, Vice President, Commercial and W. J. D. Geary, General Superintendent. E. A. Hagenbuch, the utility's Safety Engineer, and the Safety Instructors from each of PP&L's six divisions who have spearheaded the company's drive to make employees safety conscious also attended.


