United Religious Meeting Planned

Highlights of the Seventh Annual United Religious Service at Hershey Park Sports Arena on Sunday, August 22, at 7 p.m. DST, will include the inspirational song service under the direction of Jack Boyer, a prominent Methodist layman and business man. Mr. Boyer has conducted the music of many large religious gatherings. A four piano ensemble will be played by the quartet including Mrs. Harry G. Trefz, of Hummelstown; Mrs. Russell J. Klich of Harrisburg; Mrs. Andrew C. Kealey, and Andrew C. Keeley, of New Cumberland.

"What's Your Salary?" is the subject of Dr. "Bob" Jones, Jr., president of the Bob Jones University, Greenville, S. C., who will address the gathering. Dr. Jones is one of America's outstanding educators. The new university plant which was completed in fifteen months at a cost of \$4,500,000 representing twenty-five foreign countries in the student body of almost 3000 students during the past school year.

The slogan "Where 6000 Christians Meet" has been used as an attendance goal which may exceed last year's attendance. The sports arena has a seating capacity of 10,000.

T. Ernest Rowden, of Prospect Park, state president, will read the Scripture and the Rev. O. Bruce Poulson, of Camp Hill, representing the United Churches will offer prayer.

The ushers under the direction of Paul A. Seavers, of Hershey, will form a large electric cross.

The Boy Scouts under the leadership of J. Edgar Harkins, of Hershey, will carry the Christian and Old Glory flags during the services.

Special Film Will Be Shown Sunday

"Again Pioneers" will be the religious film that will be shown at the Mount Joy Youth Council Vesper service Sunday evening, Aug. 22. Miss Mary Jane Groff will be in charge of the service.

"Again Pioneers" is a film by the Protestant Film Commission and is released through The Religious Film Association, Inc. It is the story of a young attorney in a town who was selected to rid the community of the menace of a "shack-town" of migrants on the city's outskirts.

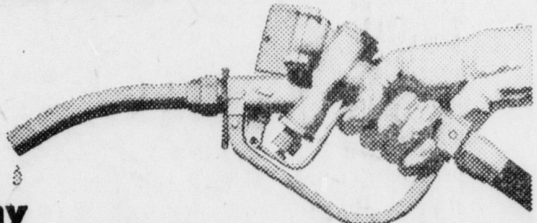

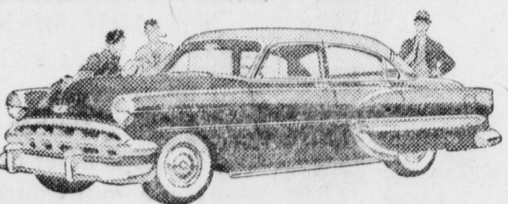

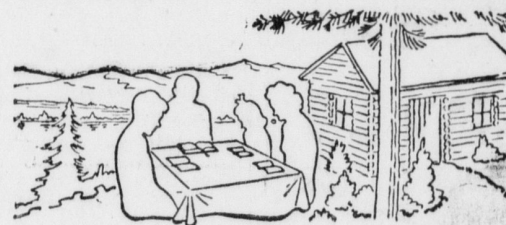
