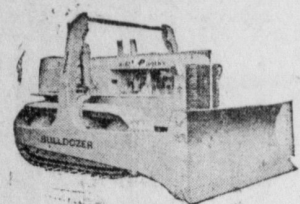

Farm Calendar

Timely Reminders from The Pennsylvania State University College of Agriculture

Produce Clean Seed — Potato leaf roll, caused by a virus, results in low yield and poor quality. To produce certified seed free of leaf roll, potato growers go through the fields several times during the season and rogue out any affected plants in the seed stock.

Pullet Needs Lime — As the growing pullet nears maturity, its need for lime steadily increases. First, it needs the lime to build strong bones and for other body structures and functions. Later it needs the lime to make sound egg shells.

Use Rye for Pasture — Many Pennsylvania dairymen are using rye to extend their pasture season at both ends — fall and spring, two varieties are being used. Balbo has been accepted by many Penna. dairymen. Tetra Petkus, a new German variety, shows promise.

Care for House Plants — Before cold weather sets in, while you can still get good topsoil in workable condition, it is good practice to repot your house plants in new soil.

Thin Fall Vegetables — Be sure to thin the late vegetables. The best time to thin them is when they are 2 to 3 inches high. These plants need space to grow if they are to mature before cold weather.

For Safe Driving — Any obstructions where the farm driveway enters the highway should be removed as a safety measure.

Farmers Use Banks For Most Of Cash Needs

More than 88 percent of the banks in Pennsylvania served agriculture by making credit available to farmers in 1953. Figures from a special study made by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation and released by the American Bankers Association show that 774 of the 888 insured commercial banks in the state made loans to farmers during the year. The remaining 114 banks are from urban areas of the state.

Banks in Pennsylvania are largest lenders to farmers for their credit requirements. At the beginning of 1954, the farm debt held by all banks in the state amounted to \$118,956,000 as compared to \$115,885,000 on January 1, 1953. This figure is more than double the amount of \$48,089,000 loaned to farmers by all other lending agencies combined.

The \$118,956,000 figure is broken down into two categories: non-real estate farm credit and farm real estate mortgage credit. Non-real estate credit, extended for production and operating purposes to finance the growing and marketing of crops and the breeding, raising, and marketing of livestock, totals \$59,385,000. Farm real estate mortgage credit, which includes all real estate mortgage loans secured by farm land, totals \$59,571,000.

In addition, a sum of \$16,611,000 in Commodity Credit Corporation loans to farmers was held by banks in connection with the Government's farm price-support program. This represents a tremendous increase over the \$482,000 in Commodity Credit Corporation loans held by banks last year.

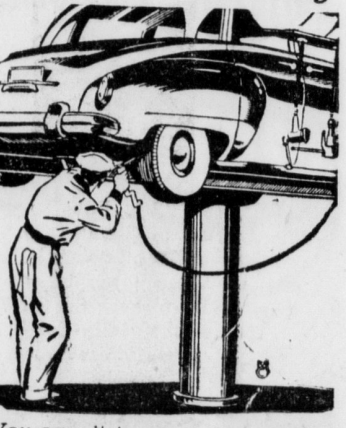
