### Talkative Driver Is Criticized

The talkative driver who turns his head to look at his traveling companions is sharply criticized by the Keystone Automobile Club.

"The number of such drivers," said Edward P. Curran, safety director of the club, "is legion, and their deadliness has yet to be computed by statisticians. No one knows how many accidents have been caused by this foolhardy yet common practice."

After experience with turn-head drivers, the club officials said, many people have made it a rule never again to ride with a driver who takes his eyes off the road to look at them.

Keystone Safety engineers emphasize the hazards involved in this practice by showing the distance at various speeds.

The driver who takes his eyes off the road to gaze at companions for "just a second" is actually driving blind over 58 feet of road at 40 miles per hour; 66 feet at 45, and 73 feet at 50.

Under present day traffic conditions, the club contends the drivers should never lose sight of the road ahead. Too many things happen in split seconds, it is pointed out, for any laxity in the driver's seat.

It is admitted that the head-turning habit, once formed, is hard to break, but the club suggests at this point a legitimate function for the "back seat driver." Calling the driver's attention to the hazard may be effective in helping him overcome the habit.

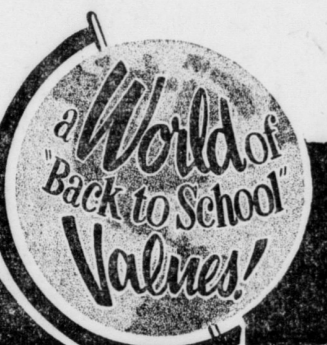

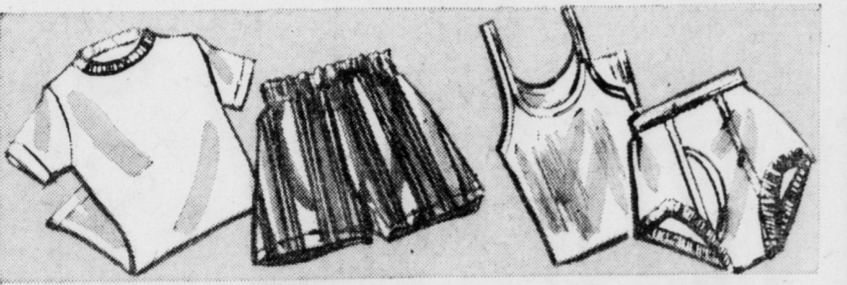

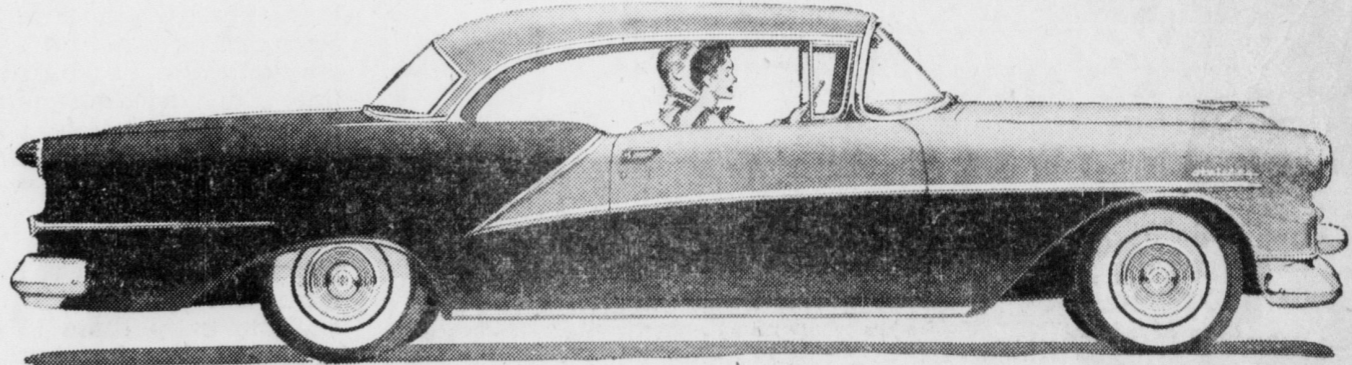
