## Direct Loan Program Extended For Veterans

The Veterans Administration Direct Loan Program, to aid veterans in the purchase or construction of homes or farmhouses in areas where private financing is not available, has been extended under Public Law 611 signed by the President, Aug. 21, 1954, Bernard A. O'Hara, Manager, Veterans Administration Regional Office in Wilkes-Barre, announced today.

The new statute extends the program until June 30, 1955. The new law authorizes the treasury to advance VA up to \$150,000,000 in quarterly allotments of \$37,500,000 during the current fiscal year. This is \$50,000,000 more than was authorized for the Direct Loan Program during each of the two previous years.

The newly authorized funds will be distributed to eligible direct loan areas in quarterly allotments. Veterans already on waiting lists will have first call on funds in their respective areas.

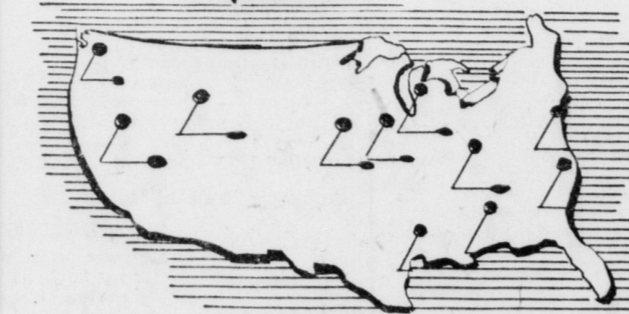

There were 39,000 veterans on the waiting list June 30, 1954. However, VA believes a considerable number of these veterans have made other plans and will not follow through with their direct loan applications when their turns are reached.

A total of \$411,091,700 has been made available to the Direct Loan Revolving Fund since the inception of the program in April, 1950. This has been made possible through the treasury advances, sales of mortgages, and principal repayments.

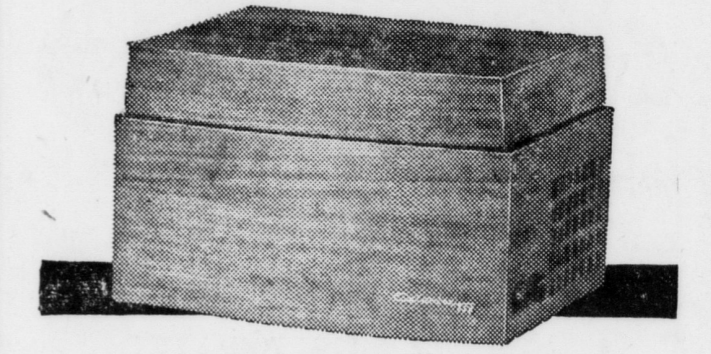
