**AAA Launches  
Member Drive**

Setting their sights on such objectives as boosting the Commonwealth's tourist trade to a \$500 million Dollar industry, establishing driver training courses in all of the State's high schools, and continuing at a more intensified scale the never ending battle to protect the best interests of the motor public, AAA motor clubs in Pennsylvania today launch a State-wide campaign to expand membership beyond the 500,000 mark. It was announced by former State Senator Andrew J. Sordani, of Wilkes-Barre, president of the AAA Pennsylvania Motor Federation.

"In less than a half century," Mr. Sordani said, "AAA motor clubs in Pennsylvania have grown from an initial membership of fewer than 1,000 owners of horseless carriages to nearly 500,000 motorists. Throughout this time, our clubs have worked without letup to improve motoring conditions in the State. With the millions to whom our highways are so vital today, the need for the services performed by motor clubs is constantly growing."

R. B. Maxwell, of Harrisburg, secretary-manager of the PMF, joined the former State Senator in pledging that AAA clubs throughout the Commonwealth will continue to protect the best interests of the motorists of the State.

Pennsylvania has the largest AAA membership of any State in the nation, with the exception of California, Mr. Sordani said. The 57 AAA motor clubs throughout the Commonwealth are members of the Federation and affiliated with the nationwide American Automobile Association. Mr. Sordani, who is secretary of the State Department of Commerce, is also the senior vice-president of the AAA, and president of the Wyoming Valley Motor Club in Wilkes-Barre.

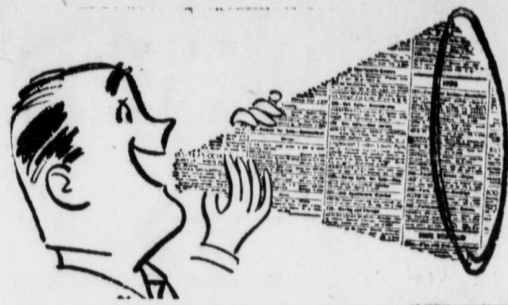

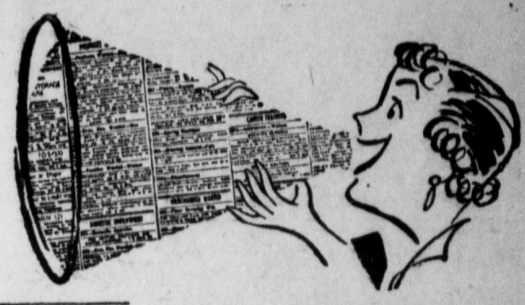

**Highway Hypnosis  
One Of Summer  
Driving Dangers**

Highway hypnosis is an especially dangerous and often fatal summer complaint. What causes it and how can it be combated? "Monotony, repetition and freedom from distraction are the relaxing factors which often lull motorists into a trance or self-induced hypnosis," warns Edward P. Curran, safety director of Keystone Automobile Club. "Other factors are sense-dulling summer heat and humidity, and new super-highways and turnpikes that wind thru the country-side for hundreds of miles without billboards, stop lights and intersections.

"The car's purring mechanical perfection, the seemingly endless stretches of bright road surfaces, the minimum of curves and grades, the rhythmic pattern of lights at night, also add to the cumulative hypnotic effect. Then comes the danger; the driver has ceased to think and be alert and the car literally is driving itself toward an accident.

"What can we do to avoid highway hypnosis? "Several simple but very effective things. On long trips motorists should stop at regular, frequent intervals and get from behind the wheel for a cup of coffee or a 'stretch.' If driving alone, the motorist should lower the car windows in order to get or create a breeze, munch candy or chew gum, and turn on the car radio. One must be careful in using the radio, however; commentators and speakers will help to keep the senses alert, but such things as soothing music must be avoided.

"Passengers in a car can be a big help in overcoming the trance-like state of mind by keeping up an interesting flow of conversation. In fact, this is one instance in which back-seat driving is highly excusable... if it isn't too distracting.

"Summing up, then, the motorist can avoid dangerous mental numbness by having a mild curiosity about everything and by employing slight distractions to keep the mind from taking a psychic siesta."
