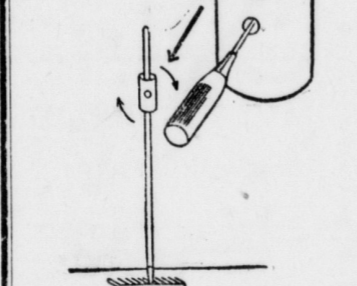

How to Store a Rake

RAKES, usually stored by leaning against a wall, have a bad habit of fighting back when they are stepped on. How a Florida man ended this nuisance was described recently in Family Handyman.

The materials he required for making the simple safety device were a tin



can with the top and bottom cut off, and a wood screw.
He punched a hole in one side large enough to admit the screw and one on the opposite side large enough for a screwdriver. Then he attached the device to the wall of his garage.

The can pivots sufficiently to permit the rake handle to be inserted. This holder has ended the "fights" when the man stepped on the teeth of the rake.

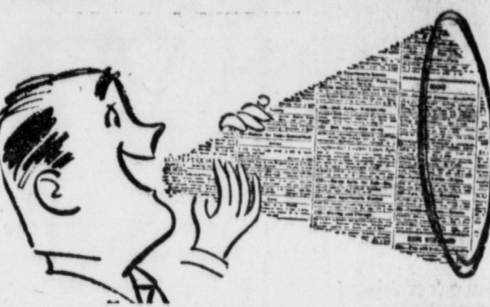

Infantry Division Plans Reunion

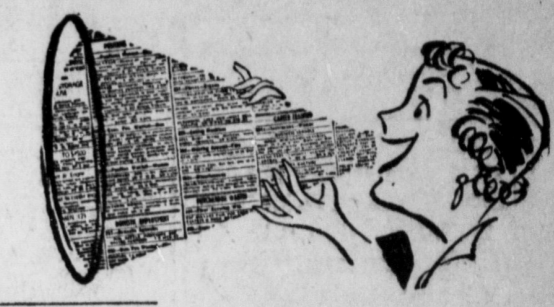

The supply of Gamma Globulin is sufficient for the needs of the City and County of Lancaster and Boroughs of the County, but is not sufficient to give to all persons not in contact with a case.

There is no charge for Gamma Globulin. The physician administering Gamma Globulin will make a charge for his services. Three-fourths of the Gamma Globulin available is paid for by the National Infantile Paralysis Foundation, one-fourth by the American Red Cross. The supply now on hand in the Office of the State Department of Health is furnished by the American Red Cross.
