Social Security Benefit Raises Are Automatic

"If you are now receiving social security benefits please do not call or write your local social security office to ask about increased benefits." This plea was issued today by Munsey S. Gleaton, manager of the Lancaster office of the Social Security Administration. "Benefit increases will be made automatically beginning with the checks to be mailed early in October."

Mr. Gleaton's request to the beneficiaries not to call or write the office was prompted by the large number who understood it would be necessary for them to take some action to obtain the increased amounts recently authorized by Congress.

No such action is necessary according to the local office staff. Benefit increases will be made automatically by the office with no action from the beneficiaries. "As a matter of fact," said manager Gleaton, "making inquiries about a claim that is ready for payment merely serves to delay rather than expedite prompt payment. 'Right now,' he added, "we are most interested in processing applications that have been received since the act was changed August 1, 1954."

"In spite of previous requests to old-age insurance beneficiaries not to call or write about their increases authorized by the recent amendments there are still a large number of applicants flooding the local social security office with requests for information. 'It is not necessary for the applicant to do anything to get the increased amount,' the manager of the Lancaster office said.

The benefit checks to be mailed out about October 3rd will be issued for the increased amounts.

The Social Security checks for September, 1954, which should arrive on or about Oct. 3 will include the increased benefits amount. If that check does not show the increase Mr. Gleaton suggests that the persons wait until the end of October. By that time all beneficiaries on the Social Security roll should have their complete increase.

Road have only to enter Mount Joy via the main highway.

The group decided to ask several citizens to cut the weeds on properties within the borough limits. The PP&L Company will be asked to trim the trees to make the street lights more visible. The secretary will also write to the state department asking that some corrective measures be taken on the Marietta Ave. The men expressed their feelings that since the new school is in operation there will be more traffic on the road. Therefore, some correction must be made to the dangerous corner at the Eberle Cemetery.

A "No Parking" restriction was passed for the west side of North Jacob Street from Mount Joy Street to Apple Tree Alley. The group also decided that for the welfare of small children walking to the new elementary school, property owners on Columbia Ave. from South Barbara Street to Walnut Alley and from South Delta Street to the existing pavement at the St. Luke's Episcopal Church be asked to put in pavements.

The matter of placing school bus signs within the borough was discussed but the group felt that it is a matter for the school board. Two drainage problems of surface water were discussed one on South Market St. and one on School Lane. Both were tabled until next year's budget is set up.

Two deeds for alleys were accepted by the group. A deed from Clinton H. Eby was accepted for the continuance of East Alley from its existence on N. Market Street to Eby Alley which runs parallel to North Barbara Street. A deed from Amos Nolt was accepted for the continuance of Angle Alley which runs parallel to South Barbara Street beyond New Street. Motions were made to accept the deeds and advertise the ordinance.

Bills to the amount of \$2,105-83 were ordered paid.

Two Schools To Sponsor Joint Community Project

Elizabethtown College and Patton School for Boys will open their second Community Program Series with the presentation of Arthur Lynds Bigelow, bellmaster of Princeton University.

Scheduled to appear in the college auditorium - gymnasium at 8 p. m. Saturday (Sept. 18), Professor Bigelow will use his forty-two bell portable carillon in a program titled "The Charm of the Carillon."

A graduate of the Carillon School at Mechlin, the concert artist and consultant on bells and carillons is professor of engineering and author of "Carillon" and "Music from the Belfry." Carillonneur of the Princeton Graduate College carillon, Prof. Bigelow was consultant to the people of France in 1950 when they cast and presented 58 replicas of the Liberty Bell to the people of the United States.

All five numbers of the program series planned by the two institutions will be presented in the college auditorium. The second number scheduled for Monday, Nov. 8 will be Garfield Henrys "Silvertones," a negro quintet of concert musicians. Their program will include religious, classical, and modern folk and negro songs.

A film lecture scheduled for Feb. 21 will bring to campus Dr. Ruroy Sibley in "The Universe of Palomar," an adventure into boundless space.

"Behind the Iron Curtain as a Guest of the Communists" will be presented March 24 by Vincent Toraora, author of "Communist Perspective."

The United States Navy Band under the baton of Commander Brender, U.S.N. will present the final number in the series Monday, April 18.

All programs are open to the public.
