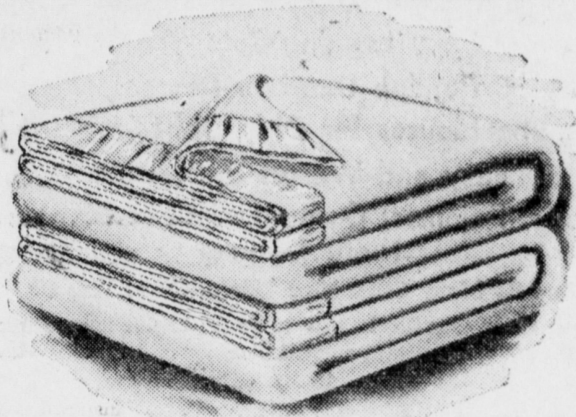

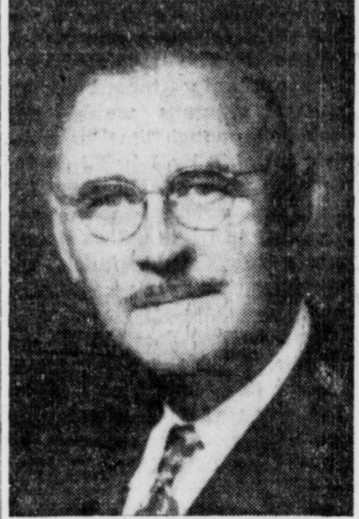

Missionary From China To Speak To Methodists

The Rev. Robert T. Henry, D.D., for 30 years a missionary of the Methodist Church in China, for several years head of the Protestant churches' relief

agencies in that country, will be the guest-speaker at Mt. Joy Methodist Church Sunday, September 26 at 9:30 and 10:40 a. m.

Dr. Henry is now the business manager of the Board of Missions of the Methodist Church, with headquarters in New York City. Since leaving China in Feb. 1951, when communists overran the country and made relief impossible, Dr. Henry has been on the staff of Church World Service and has been counselling with Agricultural Missions, Inc. in its relations with the United Nations' Technical Assistance program. Previous to that he had given several years to relief work in China.

Evacuated from China in '42, after several months of internment by the Japanese, Dr. Henry was one of the first American missionaries to return in 1943 when the Japanese were defeated. For a year before America's entry into World War II, he had been carrying on relief work in Hongkong and neighboring communities under the American Red Cross and the Church Committee for China Relief.

Before the war and postwar situation made relief work a major undertaking of the churches, Dr. Henry's ministry had been mainly in Sochow as director of institutional features of the world-famous Kong Hong Institutional Church. Through its educational classes, clinics, clubs, bathhouses for men and women, and other activities, this church reached many thousands of people during a period of a quarter of a century or more. It is now believed to be in operation in the hands of the Chinese Christians.

Dr. Henry first went to China as a missionary of the former Methodist Episcopal Church, South, in 1919. Prior to that he was a teacher and headmaster at Millsaps Preparatory School in Mississippi. He is a native of Alabama and was educated in Mississippi. His theological training was at Emory University, Georgia.

Rev. B. A. Carew To Speak Sunday At St. Mark's

The Rev. B. A. Carew will speak Sunday at 9:30 a.m. at St. Mark's E.U.B. Church. He is a native of Sierra Leone and received his primary education in one of our mission schools up country. On completing his elementary training, he enrolled as a student at Albert Academy, a secondary school for boys, in Freetown. He made such a good scholastic record and proved to be a lad of such fine character and Christian earnestness that he was sent to continue his studies in the Theological Department of Fourah Bay College, in Freetown.

When he completed this work, he was assigned to the pastorate at Talama, a typical African town of 700-800 population. He has continued in the pastorate there ever since. He has done such excellent work that this past spring his congregation finished a fine new church building with a seating capacity of 650. It is constructed out of concrete blocks which the men made themselves.

In addition to his pastoral duties, Mr. Carew serves as District Superintendent of the Bo Area of the Sierra Leone Conference. He preaches eloquently both in Mendi and in English. The Sierra Leone Conference elected Mr. Carew as their delegate to the coming General Conference. This is his first visit to America.

Plans Institute For Teachers

An Institute for teachers and Workers with children will be held on six Sunday evenings, beginning Sept. 26, in the Washington Street Church of the Brethren, Elizabethtown. The theme for the Institute will be "Guidance Growing Children in the Christian Faith With the Home and Church Working Together."

The Teachers for the various age groups of the Institute will be Mrs. Charles E. Weaver, of Manheim, Nursery; Mrs. Albert L. Gray, Jr., Kindergarten; Mrs. Frederick Hollingshead, Harrisburg, Primary; Miss Gladys Weaver, of Lancaster, Junior. Classes will convene at 6 o'clock and continue until 7:20, with a 7:30 worship hour following in the Church sanctuary, related to the topics under discussion. The first session this coming Sunday will begin with a light supper and at the evening worship hour, the Director of the School, Mrs. Albert L. Gray, Jr., will speak on "The Spiritual Growth of Teachers and Parents." Teachers, Parents, and Workers in neighboring churches are invited to share in the program of the Institute.
