Society Reports On Service Given During Summer

Service to 84 new patients was given by the Lancaster Co. Society for Crippled Children & Adults during the summer months. Of this group 40 were given special exercises. Twenty-two different diagnoses were made. A total of 289 patients were examined in the 10 clinics.

The physical therapist gave 649 treatments; 426 of these meant visits into patients' homes. 217 visits were made to check on braces, shoes and plaster of paris casts.

A total of 493½ volunteer hours were given by the Easter Seal group, members of the Board of Directors, the Junior League and friends of Crippled Children. The Community Chest did some special multi-lithing for the Society.

The occupational therapist gave 235 treatments. Trying to help patients to help themselves is her major aim. She held craft classes throughout the summer.

Six children spent 8 weeks at Camp Easter Seal near Somerset; one spent 8 weeks at Harmony Hall near Highspire; 3 spent 4 weeks at the Variety Club Camp near Downingtown and 1 adult spent 10 days at Daddy Allen near White Haven.

Through the courtesy of the following groups crippled children were able to attend various activities.

Local Shrine Club - Shrine Circus in Harrisburg (23 children). Manheim Twp. Fire Co. - King Circus (14 children). M. W. Seitz, Box Seat Chairman of the Horse Show Management (17 children). Venture Club - Water Show for the Benefit of Cerebral Palsy (30 children).

As a public service, WGAL-TV presented two shows on camping - one on pre-camping in June and one on post-camping in August.

On July 27, Miss Constance Streeter was added to the staff. She is a physical and occupational therapist, but is doing physical therapy for the Society.
