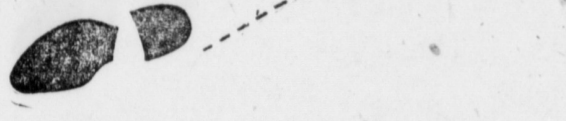

## Former Citizen Is Prospecting For Uranium

John L. Brandt, former Mt. Joy resident, a son of Mrs. C. O. Brandt, South Market Street and Columbia Ave., is doing aerial prospecting for uranium near Canon City, Colorado.

Mr. Brandt flies over the open countryside with a special instrument similar to a geiger counter in his plane and watches for signs of radio-activity on the ground. When he receives radioactive signals, he makes notes on his aerial maps and then retraced that part of the map on the ground with a geiger counter and jeep.

Thus far, he and two partners have one claim. The success of their claim is not as yet known.

Mr. Brandt and his brother Charles O. served as co-pilots in the Air Transport Command ferrying planes across the Atlantic during World War II. He also was an instructor and served 17 months in Cairo, Egypt, flying cargo and passengers between Cairo and India. He became a commercial pilot with an instructor's rating from the Wilkinson School of Aeronautics at LeRoy, N. Y.

After the war, he set up a charter plane service in Lancaster County. He used an amphibian which enabled him to take off from either Lancaster Municipal Airport or a special base on the Susquehanna River at Long Level.

## Rotary to Observe Anniversary

George Keener, Golden Anniversary chairman for the Mount Joy Rotary club, Tuesday noon outlined plans that are being made for the observance of the 50th anniversary of the founding of Rotary International.

The celebration will start on Feb. 23 and extend through June 2.

Mr. Keener urged as many Rotarians as possible to attend the convention, which this year will be held in Chicago. A special train will be chartered to take Rotarians from this district. The convention this year will feature a number of special attractions pertinent to the Golden Anniversary observance.

A number of ways in which the anniversary may be observed locally were suggested, including:

Increased emphasis on acquainting the young people of the community with Rotary's Four-Way test, stepping up assistance in the field of vocational service, increasing support of the Rotary foundation through which American young people are sent to foreign countries as exchange students, a campaign for more members, a Golden Anniversary dinner.

Mr. Keener informed the club that a souvenir issue of The Rotarian, monthly publication, is being prepared, and that a book, "Rotary's 50 Years of Service," will be published. Also there will be available a film, "The Great Adventure," dealing with Rotary International—its founding and its growth.
