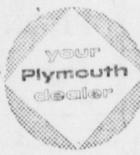

## Social Security Benefit Checks Show Increase

When the monthly old-age and survivors insurance checks were delivered this week, all retired persons and all families on the rolls will find their payments increased. These increases, which range from very modest amounts to individual members of some families, up to as much as \$31.30 to some widows with several children, result from the 1954 Amendments to the Social Security Act. All the six-and-a-half-million people receiving monthly social security payments will benefit from the changes, said Munsey S. Gleaton, manager of the Lancaster social security district office. That includes approximately 10,850 beneficiaries in Lancaster County he said.

The new payment rates are for the month of September. At the time the August checks were delivered, about Sept. 3, every beneficiary received notice of the forthcoming increases, with caution that he needed to take no action to secure the higher payments. All changes have been made automatically, in a huge book-keeping operation carried out in the several social security payment centers over the country, and in the Treasury disbursing offices which prepare and mail the checks.

The present payment of \$25 to a retired worker will go up to \$30. The highest monthly payment to a retired worker is now \$35; beginning with the September checks, this will be raised to \$38.50. Comparable increases will be made to other retired workers.

Dependents and survivors receiving monthly payments will get proportionate increases. Gleaton declared. The largest total payment to a family will be raised from \$168.50 to \$200. As heretofore, however, the largest monthly benefit payable to a family cannot be more than 80 percent of its insured worker's average monthly earnings. In all cases, all families will receive an increase of at least \$5 monthly in their total benefit payments.

Gleaton said that in cases where 80 percent of the insured worker's average monthly earnings would reduce the total payment to a family below \$50, the family will get \$50.

The following table shows examples of the monthly benefit increases which retired workers will find in their September checks which will reach them early in October.
