P. P. & L. Dedicates New Plant

Martins Creek, Pa., Oct. 12 — Pennsylvania Power & Light Company formally dedicated its big new Martins Creek plant, located along the Delaware River about 10 miles above Easton. Senator Edward Martin (R-Pa.) and Chas. E. Oakes, PP&L president, spoke to several hundred guests of the utility company at special ceremonies following a conducted tour of the new plant. Senator Martin told the group that the creative genius of Am-

erica has always been the product of free men striving in a free land in an atmosphere of free enterprise. Our form of government, he added, is based on freedom of the individual, and the statesmen who founded it knew that government cannot give freedom, that its duty is to maintain and protect freedom and liberty.

Soviet Russia, which today has the second of the world's two principal forms of government, he pointed out, advocates an all-powerful state. They are gambling on the behalf that most men of the world do not appreciate freedom.

Martins Creek power plant, the Pennsylvania law maker re-

marked, stands as a symbol of enterprise, industry, ingenuity, invention and America's faith in the future. It "depicts the continuing growth and development of America."

Senator Martin then traced the growth of the electric industry and the contributions it has made to national well-being. Its great development, he said, as with other industrial growth and progress, comes from the American free enterprise system. Foresight and planning have characterized the electric industry throughout its history. Martins Creek, he pointed out, is evidence that these qualities "are still in full flower."

Senator Martin vigorously de-

fended the new law to end the government monopoly on atomic energy and open the door to its development by American industry. Through the competition, ingenuity, incentive and know-how of private enterprise, he added, the development of atomic power now may go ahead for the benefit of people in the way of peace.

Chas. E. Oakes, PP&L president, said in part:

"Our dedication of this plant comes at the time when the electric industry is celebrating its Diamond Jubilee anniversary. For it was on October 21, 1879 — 75 years ago almost to the day — that Thomas A. Edison invented the first practical elect-

ric lamp. And so in this dedication, we pay tribute to this man — and his amazing idea, the commercial application of electricity to the needs of mankind. His invention of the incandescent lamp signaled the birth of the electric industry.

"The application of atomic energy to the production of electricity has captured the imagination of the entire nation. We in Pennsylvania Power & Light Company are aware of its potentialities and have recently signed a contract with the Atomic Energy Commission to conduct a study looking toward its eventual use on our system. Several years of study and experimentation are before us in the industry. If the outcome provides us with a new and useful source of fuel that will be competitive and lower in cost than present sources we foresee widespread use of this new energy source. We will be in the vanguard in its use.

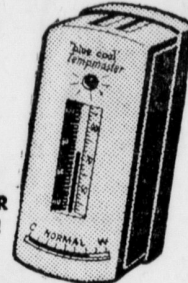

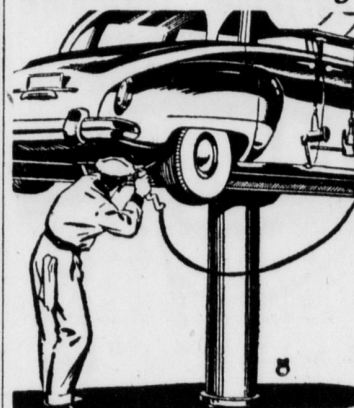
Ferguson accepted the award for the company at a recent annual meeting of the Pennsylvania Electric Association held in Pittsburgh.

To become the first recipient of the newly created award, safety-conscious PP&L employees worked more than 10 million man-hours without sustaining a disabling injury due to electric shock or burn during the contest period, July 1, 1953 to June 30, 1954.
