Board Finds Old Coins In Cornerstone

The opening of the cornerstone of the original portion of the Marietta Avenue grade school took place at the meeting of the Mount Joy Borough School Board held recently. Although the workmen removed the box, the contents were wet and could not be moved. Wednesday night, members of the school board opened the dried box and examined the contents.

Several of the papers found within could not be read and some will be micro-filmed at a later date. Of the items which could be read were the following which according to the date of the box were placed in the stone July 25, 1872, 10:00 p.m.:

Metal check from the Pennsylvania Railroad, by-laws of the Knights of Templar; Pennsylvania School Journal; corn cob and individual envelopes. Each envelope was labeled with individual names and each contained one or two individual items. The legible ones were Jacob R. Song, a banker, quarter of a dollar and 25c currency piece; J. Wood Douglas, 1c piece and Washington and Independence medal; Phillip Pyle, Lincoln and Washington coin, Spanish coin and 6 1/4c coin; Joseph Miller, 1/2c piece; Elmer Smith, photographs and tin types (but they are not legible); J. H. Furgeson, postmaster, 1861 1/2c piece and 5c piece; William Dierolf, a German coin; George Walton, 25c piece.

Loose coins in the box included an 1864 2c piece; 1869 5c piece; 1866 5c piece, an unidentified 1806 coin, 1825 quarter, 1865 dime and a bank token. Several other coins will be identified after being cleaned. Another envelope containing a list of graduates of the Mt. Joy High School up until 1872. No records existed before 1882 until this list was found.

Another item discovered in the school was a second cornerstone. Workmen uncovered a second cornerstone. Workmen uncovered a water-soaked tin box which was located some where in either the second or third addition of the school. It was too wet to examine at the meeting but will be dried and examined at a later date.

They announced that thermostats will be placed in all the rooms in order that a more uniform heating system may be established. A. D. Seiler, president, was in charge of the meeting.

Company Receives Two New Members

Two new members were received into the Mt. Joy Friendship Fire Company, No. 1 at their regular meeting Thursday evening. They are Paul Lawver and Edward Bell, Jr.

The group announced the completion of the placing of yellow and red tags on the cover of the new telephone books listing the fire company's fire call number. Ray Myers, fire chief, reported no calls during September. Miller Wolgemuth, president, was in charge of the meeting.

Local Companies Help In Depot Demonstration

Within 28 minutes, the fire companies from Mount Joy, Florin, Bainbridge, Ironville, Marietta and Maytown had arrived at the Marietta Transportation Depot, laid more than two-thirds of a mile of hose and had water coming through the hoses in a recent demonstration. Some of the fire companies travelled as far as eight miles to answer this demonstration call. Sixty eight volunteer firemen took part.

Lt. Colonel Gilbert A. Monti, commanding officer of the Marietta TC Depot and Major Daniel P. Healey, fire marshall of the installation, were exceptionally pleased with the cooperation and quick response given by these fire companies and commended them for their performance.

The Marietta Transportation Depot has mutual assistance agreements with the fire companies of the surrounding communities. A phone call was placed at 2:00 p.m. from the depot to the Zone 7 radio base station in Mt. Joy. This was relayed to the various fire companies by radio and by 2:28 p.m., all the companies had reported, connected 3,600 feet of hose and had the water flowing through those hoses.

Depot fire chief, Benjamin Groff, stated that in the event of a disaster, he was well satisfied that the surrounding communities would be on hand to render assistance within minutes and marked the demonstration as an appropriate example for Fire Prevention Week of the measures being taken in this area to prevent fire losses.

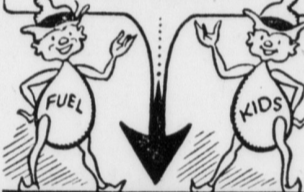

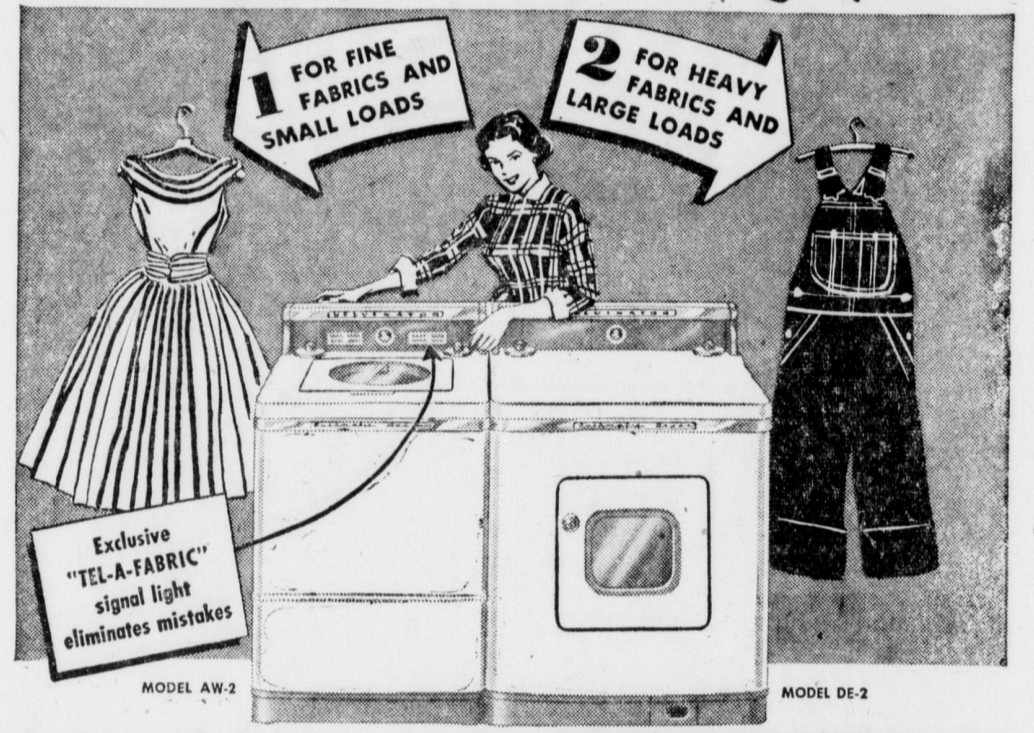
