

the 1,500 commercial apple orchards in Pennsylvania-orchards that have 100 or more trees -the flow of high quality apples will provide an abundant supply for consumer use during Pennsylvania Apple Week, Oct. 21 through Oct. 30.

According to latest estimates, this year's Keystone State apple crop will total 6,200,000 bushels, 2,000,000 more than last year and the biggest crop since 1951, the State Department of Agriculture reports.

Apple growers are now moving large quantitles of this fall and winter varieties into retail on Apple Week as the ideal time for consumers to purchase apples in large quantities and get the habit of using more apples for eating fresh and in cooking

and baking throughout the year. Hotels, restaurants, bakeries, chain and independent grocery stores, fruit wholesalers and producers are cooperating in observance of Apple Week in Pennsylvania. Incentive what is said to be the most ex tensive program in any state in the Nation came through the recently organized Pennsylvania Food Planning Council. An Apple Week sub-committee of 14 members of the council has been formed by W. S. Hagar, Acting State Secretary of Agriculture.

Bakers are increasing production of apple pies during Apple Week and hotels and restaurants are featuring apple pie with ice cream, he said. There are doughnuts and pretzels from bakeries to go with apples and plenty of fresh cider to add to the Halloween party menus. Hotels and restaurants are listing all types of apple dishes on their menus, displaying and selling small packages of eating apples over the counters.


Retail stores are advertising apples and have special displays for cooking and eating fresh. Producers and wholesalers are providing movies and special placards in the public schools and growers are featuring apples and cider at their roadside stands. The National Apple Week Association is cooperating in the Pennsylvania program, largest of its kind ever undertaken in the State.


