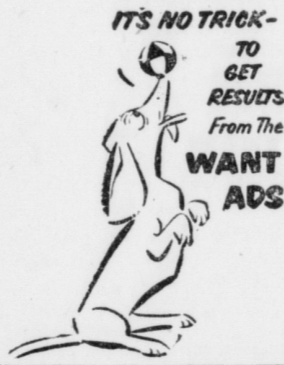
New Chevrolet

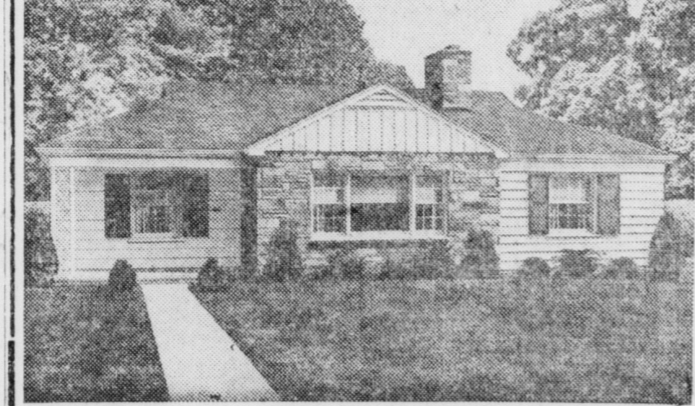

Courses in typing, shorthand, sewing, wood work, Spanish, art will be offered each Friday and Thursday from 7 to 9 p. m. At the present time, there are approximately 125 persons enrolled.

Farm Calendar

Timely Reminders from The Pennsylvania State University College of Agriculture.

Treat Fence Posts — Chemical treatment will add 15 to 20 years to the useful life of elm, pine, red oak, maple, hickory, and cottonwood fence posts. It does not pay to treat more durable wood, such as locust, osage orange, red cedar, and mulberry.

Control Parasites — For several years sheepmen have been successfully controlling internal parasites in sheep with the drug known as phenothiazine, which is given as a drench or is mixed with salt and given free choice.

Feed New Grains — When poultrymen ask how soon they should start feeding new grains Harry Kauffman, Penn State, has an answer. He says grain that is dry enough to grind should be dry enough to feed. Of course, it is always safe to start with small amounts and increase gradually.

Collect Soil Now — Soil for growing plants in coldframes and hotbeds next spring should be collected now and placed on a compost pile. The soil can be sterilized to control disease and insects.

Use Built-Up Litter — To save labor in cleaning the poultry house, use built-up litter. The secret of built-up litter is just to add small amounts of litter from time to time.

Cull Beef Cattle — Fall is generally the season when most beef cattle breeders cull their herds and select replacement heifers.

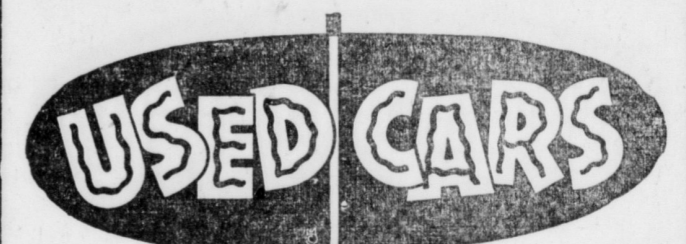

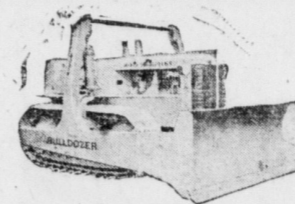
