Instructors And Rooms Are Announced For Nite Classes

Courses and teachers have been announced by school officials for the Donegal High classes which will begin next Monday, Nov. 1. Typing I will be taught by Roy Armaid in Room 117. Typing II will be offered Thursdays from 7-9. At the present time there are too many people registered for the course to have all meet on either night. Therefore, it would be appreciated if those people who can do so, will attend the Thursday class. When the sizes of the classes are determined it may be possible for the students to vary the nights of attendance or to attend both classes. People enrolling for the Thursday class may also register for a different course scheduled to meet Mondays.

Shorthand I will meet Mondays in Room 140 from 7-9 with Mrs. Clara Krotzer as instructor. Shorthand II will meet on Thursdays from 7-9 in Room 115. Mrs. Krotzer will also teach this class. While this group is interested primarily in stenography, it will also have access to typewriters for transcription purposes.

A refresher class in typing and shorthand will meet Mondays in Room 115 with Mrs. Norman Housell as instructor. One hour will be spent on each subject during the evening. Classes in woodshop will be held Mondays from 7-9. Charles Rovenolt and Hubert Peters will be the instructors. Instruction will be given in the operation of various woodworking machines. Students will complete projects of their own selection.

The sewing class will be organized Monday evening with Mrs. Almeda Griffith as instructor. This course will cover the fundamentals of sewing and sewing machine operation. Spanish I will meet in Room 119 with Mrs. Nancy Seldomridge as instructor.

The art class will not be organized until Nov. 15. At that time, it will meet in Room 121 with Mrs. Arba Herr as instructor. During the first semester, tentative plans are for teaching Pennsylvania Dutch art in the second semester, ceramics.

These classes will be organized if there are more than ten persons enrolled and if an average attendance of at least ten is maintained. A registration fee of \$2.00 will be required for students from East Donegal Twp., Mount Joy Twp., Marietta and Mount Joy Boroughs. Tuition for all others will be \$7.50.

Psychology Tests Given At Donegal

Dr. Donald English from Juniata college administered the American Council of Education psychological examination to the junior and senior academic students at Donegal high school. This examination, which predicts success in college when compared with the scores of college freshmen from all over the United States, is given by Juniata college at no cost to the school.

The examinations are scored and the results for each student are returned to the school. Twenty-one Juniors and 32 seniors availed themselves of the opportunity to take the examination. All arrangements were made through the counselor's office.

Percentage Of People To Reach Age Of 65 Constantly Increasing

In 1900, one person in twenty-five was 65 years old or older. In 1960, one in every 11 persons in the United States will be more than 65 years old, according to Dr. Henry D. Shelton, of the U. S. Bureau of Census. Medical men are keeping abreast of this increasing age of the population, older people presenting distinct medical problems.

In advance age there are numerous cases of dangerous and disabling chronic disease such as cardiovascular disease, cancer and arthritis.

Because the chance of contracting these diseases is involved with time, older persons have longer opportunity to be exposed to them. There are definite hormone deficiencies in older persons which have an effect on bone and other tissues outside the reproductive system.

Malnutrition is a serious medical problem with older people. Due in part to poor teeth, and also because they are easy to prepare, many old people live on diets of baked goods and other carbohydrate foods deficient in vitamins, minerals and other essential nutrients. Resistance to disease diminishes with the years.

A fifth and important medical problem of the aging population is that of mental deterioration possibly due to hardening of the arteries of the brain. Despite the medical, social and economic problems associated with old age, only about six per cent of persons over sixty-five live in nursing homes, homes for the aged and similar institutions. Which points to the fact that medical care of the aged is largely in the hands of the general practitioner, there being comparatively few physicians specializing in geriatrics or medical problems of the aged.
