

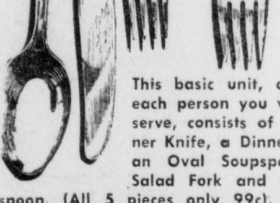

ARTHUR D. GARBER
Arthur D. Garber, Florin, died at 5:15 a. m. Wednesday at his residence, Main street, Florin, after an illness of ten days. Mr. Garber was 83 years old.

Born in Bridgeport, Perry County, the son of the late George A. and Lucinda Wentzel Garber, he attended public school in Blaine, Perry County, and was graduated from Bryant and Stratton Business College, Buffalo, N. Y.

He was appointed postmaster in Blaine, where he served until 1912, when he moved to Florin. He entered the dry goods retail business in Florin and after 10 years retired because of ill health.

Mr. Garber was later appointed postmaster of Florin, serving in that position for approximately 10 years. He was an enthusiastic hunter and fisherman throughout his entire life.

A member of Trinity Evangelical Lutheran church, Mount Joy, he served several terms on the church council. He also was a member of the I.O.O.F. Lodge 706, Blaine, Casiphia Lodge 561, A. F. and A. M. of Mount Joy, the Florin Fire Company and the Mount Joy Sportsmen's Association.

He was married to Sarah Alice Woods, Blaine, in 1893. Mrs. Garber passed away in 1946.

Mr. Garber is survived by two sons, Dr. Dale W. Garber, Lansdowne, and Eugene W. Garber, Florin, and two daughters, Mrs. Esther H. Diffenderfer, Florin, and Mrs. Anna L. Hollinger, Florin. There are also two grandchildren, Sally Ann and June E. Hollinger, and a brother, Miles D. Garber, Williamsport.

Funeral services will be held Saturday at 2 p. m. from the Trinity Evangelical Lutheran church. Friends may call at the residence in Florin Friday from 7 to 9 p. m.

Florin Church Plans Missionary Symposium

Last year (Nov. 1953) the congregation voted to build a parsonage in West Africa at a cost of \$2800. It was expected that the local church would complete the payment of the project in two years. Now it is planned that the final payment will be made at the end of Nov. 1954, instead of 1955.

The building in Africa is being erected in honor of Dr. and Mrs. John F. Musselman, who for nearly 40 years served in Africa as missionaries. Dr. Musselman is a son of the local church.

On Saturday evening, Nov. 27, 7:30 P. M., the Rev. and Mrs. Eugene Wenger, recently returned from missionary work in Japan, will speak. The Symposium concludes with the program of Sunday, Nov. 28. In the 10:30 A. M. Service, by Dr. V. P. Hovermale Executive Secretary of Home Missions in the Evangelical U. B. Church with offices in Dayton, Ohio will be the guest speaker. In the evening the Symposium will close with first a supper sponsored by the Youth Fellowship and then a message in the evening service 7:15 P. M. Rev. Carew, a native of West Africa and delegate from that country to the General Conference held in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.
